SCHOOL FACILITIES AUTHORITY FB 2023-2025 WAM-FIN BUDGET BRIEFING NARRATIVE

Overview

A. Provide your agency's mission statement, strategic objectives, goals and performance metrics. How will the agency measure progress? What milestones will be tracked?

The mission of the School Facilities Authority (the "SFA") is, "The School Facilities Authority expeditiously creates modernized learning and living environments for Hawaii's public education system by using innovative partnership models, applying sustainable financing strategies, engaging the community in the development process, and partnering with the Hawaii State Department of Education and its attached agencies."

The SFA's vision is, "The School Facilities Authority envisions Hawaii's public education system providing all students access to inspiring, purpose-built, and culturally responsive learning environments and providing readily available workforce housing to the individuals essential to the success of Hawaii's public schools."

The SFA and its board recently adopted areas of focus and strategic goals. The three areas of focus are Expanding Inspiring Learning Spaces, Spearheading Housing Solutions, and Laying an Operational Foundation. Under each area of focus are three-year and five-year goals. The table below contains the goals for each area with the three-year goals in the first column and the five-year goals in the second column.

Expanding Inspiring Learning Spaces

- **3a. Pre-K**: Renovating or constructing 143 pre-kindergarten classrooms by the end of the 2026 calendar year, including at least two innovative facilities incorporating features beyond basic classroom design.
- **3b. New Schools**: Initiate design phase for two schools using SFA Board adopted 21st century schools guidelines and identify a third school by the end of the 2026 calendar year.
- **5a. Pre-K**: Renovating or constructing 231 pre-kindergarten classrooms by the end of the 2028 calendar year, including at least four innovative facilities incorporating features beyond basic classroom design.
- **5b. New Schools**: Initiate construction phase for two schools using SFA Board adopted 21st century schools guidelines and have a third school in the design and planning stage by the end of the 2028 calendar year.

Spearheading Housing Solutions

3c. Education Workforce Housing:

Complete planning and design phases for two education workforce housing projects and identify vacant or underutilized land for a third education workforce housing project by the end of the 2026 calendar year.

5c. Education Workforce Housing:

Complete construction of two education workforce housing projects by the end of the 2028 calendar year and enter the planning phase for a third project.

Laying an Operational Foundation

3d. Legal and Organizational Framework:

Complete the creation of SFA's legal framework, including essential statutory revisions, procurement mechanisms, a governance structure, major contracts, and internal processes and protocols by the end of the 2024 calendar year.

3e. Sustainable Financing and Public- Private Partnership Model: Complete the development of systems that will maximize the value and efficient use of state lands by generating revenue and reducing operating costs while using sustainable financing methods and public-private partnership models tailored to the needs of the public education system by the end of the 2026 calendar year.

3f. Community Engagement: Establish a process to create a solid base of stakeholders and community members through communication, engagement, and transparency for each project by the end of the 2024 calendar year.

As part of the performance evaluation process of the SFA executive director, the SFA Board and executive director set annual priorities for the executive director to achieve

tied to the strategic goals stated above. These "ED Priorities" are intended to make annual progress on the goals. The performance evaluation process limits the total number of ED Priorities to no more than five each year. The five ED Priorities for the 2024 calendar year, including their performance indicators, are provided below.

ED Priority 1: Build or renovate 44 pre-kindergarten classrooms ready to open by the start of the 2024-2025 school year (Strategic Goal 3a).

Indicator 1.1: Excluding the 11 classrooms opened in August 2023, 44 additional pre-kindergarten classroom projects, paid for by Act Act 257 (2022) funds, are completed before July 30, 2024 (teachers' first day).

ED Priority 2: Identify two viable sites for workforce housing projects and execute a contract for the planning and design of one workforce housing project by December 2024 (Strategic Goal 3c).

- Indicator 2.1: By December 2024, SFA identifies and receives SFA board approval to proceed with the planning and design process for two workforce housing projects.
- Indicator 2.2: By December 2024, SFA fully executes a contract with a contractor for the planning and design of one of the workforce housing projects approved by the SFA board.

ED Priority 3: Complete the creation of SFA's legal and organizational framework by December 2024 (Strategic Goal 3d).

- Indicator 3.1: By January 2024, the SFA board adopts bylaws.
- Indicator 3.2: By July 2024, SFA's administrative rules on practice and procedure are effectuated by the governor.
- Indicator 3.3: By December 2024, SFA's puts in place major procurement mechanisms, specifically, a Job Order Contracting (JOC), Multiple Award Task Order Contract (MATOC), and PSC to expedite work.

ED Priority 4: Complete draft administrative rules governing public-private partnerships and school impact fees by December 2024 (Strategic Goal 3e).

Indicator 4.1: By December 2024, SFA drafts and receives SFA board approval for a public hearing for administrative rules governing public-private partnerships.

Indicator 4.2: By December 2024, SFA drafts and receives SFA board approval for a public hearing for administrative rules governing school impact fees.

ED Priority 5: Establish a community engagement process for projects by December 2024 (Strategic Goal 3f).

Indicator 5.1: By December 2024, SFA drafts and receives SFA board approval of a process that sets communication, engagement, and transparency expectations and procedures for contracted developers working on SFA projects.

In accordance with the executive director performance evaluation process, the SFA Board conducts a mid-year review in June, which includes a check-in on progress toward the ED Priorities. The SFA Board conducts an end-of-year performance evaluation in December, which includes rating the executive director on how well he accomplished the ED Priorities.

B. Discuss how current state-wide conditions have affected agency operations and the ability to meet goals. Identify and discuss notable performance measures, expected outcomes, and recent results.

The wildfires and the ensuing economic fallout have required the governor to find funds to address emergency needs and balance the State's budget. The governor has taken some of the needed funds from the SFA's appropriations, namely \$45 million of its \$50 million appropriation for teacher housing. While the governor will propose through his budget request that the \$45 million be replaced in the next fiscal year with general obligation bonds, having less cash on hand now and a different means of financing in the future for education workforce housing might affect how quickly the SFA can meet its education workforce housing goals.

Similarly, we understand that the governor will be requesting that \$100 million of the \$200 million dedicated to building pre-kindergarten classrooms be converted to general obligation bonds to help balance the State's financial plan. Again, less cash and a different means of financing might affect how quickly the SFA can meet its pre-kindergarten classroom goals.

Federal Funds

C. Identify programs that have lost or are at risk of losing federal funds. Identify the source of these federal funds by federal award title and CFDA number. Discuss the impact to the public and your planned response, including efforts to supplant any federal fund

reductions for the current year (FY23) and the upcoming fiscal year (FY24) with other funds.

The SFA does not have any programs or projects receiving federal funds.

Non-General Funds

The SFA has not yet submitted a report on non-general funds under its jurisdiction.

Budget Requests

E. Explain the process used to develop the agency's budget and prioritize requests for budget changes.

SFA staff review the projects assigned to the SFA and the current funds and means of financing available to complete those projects. Staff analyze the information available for each project and make a determination as to whether the existing funds are enough to continue to move forward with each project. If staff foresee a funding shortfall for a project, staff project the amount of funds needed to continue the project. Staff bring the projections for needed funding to the SFA Board, and the board determines whether to include the projections into SFA's budget requests to the governor.

Because the SFA is required to complete projects assigned to it, the SFA treats all budget requests related to projects at the same priority level. The SFA leaves any additional prioritization to the governor and the legislature.

F. Identify and discuss significant adjustments contained in the budget request submitted to the legislature. Explain and quantify how significant requests for additional funds are expected to affect outcomes.

As previously mentioned, the governor is requesting \$45 million in general obligation bonds for the SFA to use for teacher housing. This amount is to replace \$45 million in general funds the governor took from SFA's appropriations to address the wildfire emergency and related economic fallout. From the SFA's perspective, this request is not additional funds but a replacement of funds through a different means of finance. Note that the legislature originally appropriated \$170 million in general funds to the SFA for workforce housing before the governor decided to cut it to \$50 million to balance the State's financial plan.
