### PROBLEM: SEWAGE POLLUTION

Each day, **88,000** cesspools across Hawaii release nearly **53 million gallons** of untreated sewage into our groundwater, endangering public and environmental health. Cesspool leachate can contaminate recreational and drinking water. Act 125 mandates the upgrade of all cesspools by 2050.

**SOLUTION: WORK-4-WATER** 

To counter COVID-19's devastating effects, our Work-4-Water (W4W) Initiative will help jumpstart our economy by creating shovel-ready projects to convert cesspools in the most at-risk areas. The W4W Initiative offers homeowners a financial opportunity to replace their cesspools and help protect their community, while also training and employing specialized workers in this new field.
