LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

BILLS INTRODUCED BY REPRESENTATIVE KILA THAT ARE STILL ALIVE:

- HB278 HD1 SD2, Relating to Health. Executive Office on Aging; Department of
 - Health; Alzheimer's Disease; Related Dementias; Public Health Campaign;
 Appropriation. This measure sees to appropriate funds for the Executive Office on Aging to create an Alzheimer's disease public health campaign.
- HB1294 HD1 SD1, Relating to Elections. Elections; Candidates; Legal Name. Requires
 every candidate for public office in Hawaii to use their legal name for election
 purposes.
- HB1296 HD1 SD1, Relating to Early Intervention Services. DOH; Early Intervention Services; Working Group; Deaf and Hard of Hearing Children; Appropriation.
 - Establishes an early intervention services working group within the Department of Health to study and recommend ways to assist and support deaf and hard of hearing children, including implementation strategies. Requires report to Legislature. Appropriates moneys.

Although this is not a bill that Representative Kila directly introduced, it is the Senate version of the bill he introduced, HB275, which he asked Senator Lynn DeCoite to introduced in the Senate. This bill is still alive:

• SB782 SD2 HD1, Relating to Taro. HD0A, Taro Farmers; Grants; Appropriations. Appropriates funds to the department of agriculture to provide grants to Hawaii farming groups to be disbursed to taro farmers.

The current session ends on May 4, 2023, and we hope these bills make it to the Governor for his signature.
