

2023 LEGISLATIVE SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

HB278 CD1 - RELATING TO HEALTH

Appropriates funds for the Executive Office on Aging to create and implement an Alzheimer's disease and related dementias public health campaign.

HB1294 CD1 - RELATING TO ELECTIONS

Requires the Office of Elections and Campaign Spending Commission to include a candidate's legal name wherever the name requested to be printed on the ballot is used, except on the ballot.

HCR107 HD1

Urges the City and County of Honolulu to exempt from real property tax those property owners of residential units within one-half mile of an active municipal solid waste landfill or construction and demolition landfill or deemed to have been impacted by an active landfill to a degree that warrants such an exemption.

HCR108 HD1 SD1

Urges the establishment of a Native Hawaiian Intellectual Property Working Group to discuss policies and legislation with respect to Native Hawaiian intellectual property.
