<u>HAWAIIAN ELECTRIC UTILITY WORK TO CLOSE DIAMOND HEAD ROAD</u> <u>MAUKA LANE AND RESTRICT MAKAI PARKING, JAN. 12, 19 AND 21 – WORK</u> <u>SCHEDULED 8:30 A.M. – 3 P.M.</u>

Hawaiian Electric crews will be replacing overhead power lines along Diamond Head Road on consecutive Wednesdays, Jan. 12 and 19, and Friday, Jan. 21, from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m.

The work will close the westbound (mauka) lane in the 3100 block, between Beach Road and Makalei Place, and traffic contraflowed during the work hours. No parking will be allowed along the ocean (makai) side of the road in the work zones.

Safety signs, traffic cones and parking barricades will mark the work areas, and flagmen will provide onsite traffic control. Motorists should anticipate slower traffic and seek alternate routes when possible.
