Aloha Chair Ichiyama;

The Board of Directors for the Hawaii Law Enforcement Memorial for Fall Law Enforcement Officers would like to express our strong support for Senate Concurrent Resolution 46, SD1 / SSCR 3584 to establish a working group to plan and construct a Hawaii First Responders Memorial.

Having served in the Honolulu Police Department for 30 years, I know firsthand the importance of having a Memorial to honor those who selflessly gave their lives in the line of duty. During my career, two of my classmates from my police recruit class were killed in the line of duty whose names are inscribed on the Hawaii Law Enforcement Memorial. The Hawaii Law Enforcement Memorial provides a place where family members, friends, peers, and the public can give respect, remember and honor those who have made the ultimate sacrifice for our community.

A First Responder Memorial would provide a place of honor for fire fighters, lifeguards, paramedics, emergency medical technicians, and medical flight nurses and pilots. It is absolutely vital that we remember these heroes who died in the line of duty while serving the people of Hawaii. This measure will be the first step to honor these heroes.

On a personal note, I personally knew and worked side by side, with first responders like MICT Mandy Shiraki and Fire Fighters Cliff Rigsbee and Peter Crown who all died while in service to their community. These heroes deserve a Memorial so that we may remember their duty, dedication, commitment, and sacrifice.

The Hawaii Law Enforcement Memorial Foundation strongly supports this measure.
