## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO RESEARCH A GREEN HIGHWAY PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, green highways have been implemented across the 1 2 world to promote sustainability, reduce environmental impact, 3 and enhance the quality of life for communities along highways; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, green highways contribute to island heat mitigation by incorporating features such as green 7 infrastructure, shade trees, and reflective pavements, which 8 help lower temperatures and combat urban heat island effects; 9 10 and 11 WHEREAS, beautification efforts along green highways 12 include landscaping with native plants, creating aesthetically 13 pleasing landscapes that enhance the visual appeal of highway 14 corridors, and provide habitat for local wildlife; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, green highways offer numerous benefits, including improved air and water quality, reduced noise pollution, 18 enhanced biodiversity, and increased recreational opportunities 19 for residents and visitors alike; and 20 21 WHEREAS, green highways also promote sustainable 22 transportation options such as walking and biking trails, 23 electric vehicle charging stations, and public transit access, 24 reducing reliance on single-occupancy vehicles and lowering 25 greenhouse gas emissions; and 26 27 28 WHEREAS, the implementation of a green highway program aligns with statewide goals for environmental stewardship, 29 climate resilience, and sustainable development, contributing to 30 a healthier and more resilient future for the State's 31 32 communities; and 33

WHEREAS, a new green highway stretch in Norway, known as 1 "the Green Shortcut" (Den Grønne Snarvei), has significantly 2 reduced journey times and environmental impact between Oslo and 3 Trondheim: and 4 5 WHEREAS, considering the positive impact of green highways 6 7 on communities worldwide, the Department of Transportation must take proactive steps to explore and implement similar 8 9 initiatives in the State; now, therefore, 10 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 11 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 12 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 13 Transportation is requested to convene a task force to research 14 and develop a green highway program; and 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 17 include the following members or their designees: 18 19 The Director of Transportation, who is requested to 20 (1)21 serve as chairperson; 22 The Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural 23 (2) Resources; and 24 25 A representative with expertise in arboriculture, 26 (3) selected and invited by the chairperson; and 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 29 develop projects and define best practices to achieve 30 temperature reduction, carbon capture, and habitat restoration; 31 32 and 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including 35 any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than 36 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 37 38 2025; and 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 40 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of 41
