### 2026 BUDGET BRIEFING

#### OVERVIEW

##### **A. Mission Statement**

As outlined in Hawai'i Revised Statutes (HRS) Section 26-20, the mission of the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations (DLIR) is to *"...administer programs designed to increase the economic security, physical and economic well-being, and productivity of workers, and to achieve good labor-management relations, including the administration of workers' compensation, employment security, apprenticeship training, wage and hour, and industrial relations laws. The department shall also have the function of developing, preparing, and disseminating information on employment, unemployment, and general labor market conditions."*

DLIR's strategic objectives focus on ensuring that all workers have full and equal opportunity to work, access to safe and decent working conditions, fair treatment on the job, equitable compensation, and support in addressing work-related challenges and benefits. To achieve these objectives, the department implements major program activities, including:

- Investigation and regulatory enforcement to promote safe workplaces, fair treatment, and equitable compensation,
- Counseling, job placement, and training services to strengthen skills, job readiness, and employment opportunities, and
- Compensation programs to mitigate the impact of unemployment, workplace injuries, and disabilities.

Progress toward these goals is tracked through performance metrics and milestones, which are monitored and reported in the department's Variance Report.

## **B. Current Economic and Fiscal Conditions**

Despite the 43-day federal government shutdown, robust visitor spending, lower-than-expected inflation, a healthy labor market, and stronger-than-expected national economic performance contributed to Hawai'i's improved outlook. Real gross domestic product (GDP) grew by 2.5% compared to 2024. While DBEDT projects GDP growth of 1.5% in 2026, rising to 1.9% by 2028—with gains driven by construction, finance, and recreation—the University of Hawai'i Economic Research Organization's (UHERO) fourth-quarter forecast for 2025 cautions that Hawai'i's economy is edging toward a mild recession.

Core responsibilities of the department include administering unemployment insurance claims and supporting reemployment efforts. As of September 2025, Hawai'i's labor force totaled 687,000, with 17,200 unemployed. Overall, in 2025, initial claims averaged 5% lower than in 2024, and weeks claimed decreased by 11.5%. The statewide unemployment rate so far in 2025 is 2.8%, with projections of 2.8% in 2026, 2.7% in 2027, and 2.7% in 2028. The Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund (UCTF) exceeds \$758.95 million as of December 12, 2025, ensuring Schedule C remains in effect through the end of 2026.

While Hawai'i's economy demonstrates resilience, recent changes in federal grant funding have introduced significant uncertainty for the department. The DLIR is navigating shifting federal policies, attempted termination of certain grants, reductions in award obligations, and prolonged delays in approvals and distributions. This ongoing uncertainty poses one of the greatest risks to DLIR's ability to achieve its goals and meet program and fiscal requirements. Potential disruptions include:

- Delays in program implementation,
- Reprioritization of resources, limiting capacity to sustain recruitment and workforce initiatives,
- Inability to fulfill reporting or contractual requirements, which may result in compliance vulnerabilities and associated risks
- Uncertain or constrained staffing budgets undermining workforce stability, and
- Disruption to long-term planning that may impede progress toward strategic objectives.

## **C. Federal Funds**

Approximately 60% of the DLIR's funding comes through federal funds and the omnipresent uncertainty, reductions, and level funding through Continued Resolutions is eroding capacity.

Federal support for state administrative funding has remained largely flat, resulting in a nominal decline over time (except during the pandemic) as federal allocations have not kept pace with inflation or workload demands. Overhead costs remain largely fixed and do not decrease during periods of lower workloads. Uncertainty also persists regarding whether Congressional disagreements over funding levels will affect the federal grant that supports state administration of the federal-state unemployment insurance program. The state's administrative funding has averaged approximately \$14M

annually, therefore, any significant cut or prolonged reduction would require supplementation from other sources. Reduced administrative funding could be temporarily offset by drawing on the Special Unemployment Insurance Administration Fund (Penalties & Interest).

Three of HIOSH's five branches receive funding on an approximately 50/50 federal–state basis, while the Consultation and Training Branch is funded at a 90/10 federal–state ratio. HIOSH's enforcement grant of approximately \$1.66M requires a 50/50 match, with \$1.66M in State funds, while its consultation grant of approximately \$581,000 in federal funds requires a state match of \$63,740.

In the fourth quarter of FFY 2024, Federal OSHA reduced funding for all State Plan programs by 3.61 percent and 3.77 percent. These reductions were not restored in FFY 2025, and additional reductions are anticipated in FFY 2026. Rising payroll, overhead, legal, and operational expenses continue to strain program resources. Due to the mixed funding structure and existing staffing vacancies, HIOSH absorbed federal funding shortfalls in FY 2025. However, continued funding reductions in FY 2026 and beyond are expected to result in significant programmatic impacts, including an inability to fill vacant positions and reduced travel for training, which is a key component for the HIOSH's staff capacity.

The department administers numerous grants to support workforce development, each serving specific target populations and carrying distinct deliverables and regulatory requirements. The Workforce Development Division (WDD) manages most of these grants. An exception is the WIOA, under which the Workforce Development Council (WDC) assists the Governor with developing and modifying the State Plan and establishing formulas for allocating funds to local areas, among other responsibilities. The State's unemployment rate, particularly in comparison to the national average, is a key factor in determining how these grants are allocated among the states.

The Trump Administration has proposed the Make America Skilled Again (MASA) program that is designed to consolidate and restructure federal workforce funding into a

single block grant program to the states while reducing overall funding by about 37%. MASA would replace multiple existing workforce and training funding streams with a single, unified grant program, including the WIOA, Wagner-Peyser, and Apprenticeship grants. States would receive formula-based funding with fewer federal administrative requirements than current discrete grants, but 10% would need to be used to support registered apprenticeship activities. The goal stated by the administration is to reduce red tape and allow recipients to tailor workforce services to local labor market needs.

It remains unclear to what extent the U.S. DOL will implement this proposal. As with other federal programs, workforce funding has experienced delays and reductions and, in some cases, temporary elimination (SCSEP) followed by restoration. Planning amid shifting federal policies and limited fiscal clarity has posed significant challenges and has required the reprioritization of staffing allocations.

HCRC receives federal funds pursuant to two federal contracts, a work-sharing agreement with the EEOC, and a cooperative agreement with the Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Office of Fair Housing and Equal Opportunity. Under these annual contracts, HCRC is paid for processing fair employment and fair housing complaints that are dual-filed under state and federal laws. HCRC uses the funds received pursuant to these contracts to pay for personnel services and operating costs from year to year.

Over the past year, unexpected changes on the federal level involving the operations of the EEOC and HUD have impacted HCRC's funding outlook. HCRC fully completed the work specified under the FY2025 federal contracts months ago, and by this point in time the funds should have been made available. HCRC cautiously anticipates collecting the funds from the FY2025 EEOC contract soon, based on recent assurances made by EEOC staff. However, HUD has not given any information about the status of its FY2025 funds, despite numerous inquiries from HCRC.

Similarly, for the current (FY2026) performance period, the EEOC has reported that its new contract with HCRC should be finalized soon, but HUD has not provided any information about an upcoming contract. Federal funding from the EEOC and HUD contracts constitutes roughly 10% of HCRC's overall annual budget. If HCRC were unable to collect the federal funds from the FY2025 contracts, or if the EEOC and/or HUD chose not to renew the contracts in FY2026 and beyond, the budget shortfall would require HCRC to secure alternate sources of funding or risk a significant impact to its ability to operate effectively and provide essential services to the public.

***FAIN: 2601HIRSSS; CFDA#: 93.566 Refugee Social Services (RSS), Office of Community Services (OCS)***

The federal Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR) has indicated that the State of Hawai'i will receive reduced funding for the RSS Program for Federal Fiscal Year 2026 due to the reduced number of refugees expected by ORR to request RSS services in the State. ORR had advised that it has allocated "0" refugees to be resettled in the State. However, ORR has projected that there still may be up to 20 ORR eligible persons applying for RSS services (refugees from other states moving to Hawai'i,

trafficking victims, etc). ORR indicated that it intended to send its first allocation of RSS funds by December 2025 but subsequently advised that this allocation will be delayed.

Hawai'i normally receives essentially just minimal base funding which is approximately \$50,000 per year. We have been advised that any cuts to RSS funding will not go below the \$45,000 program base amount. For FFY2025, the State of Hawai'i was awarded \$75,000 in RSS funding. Currently, Hawai'i's RSS program has about \$183,475 in carryover funds from FFY2024 and FFY2025 to be used for FFY2026. If Hawai'i does not receive any RSS funds for FFY2026, it may have sufficient funding for the RSS program for FFY2026 as expenditures for FFY2026 are not expected to reach the level as FFY2025 due because of clientele and program shrinkage.

***FAIN: 2601HIRCMA; CFDA#: 93.566 Refugee Cash and Medical Assistance (RCMA), OCS***

The federal Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR) has indicated that the State of Hawai'i will receive reduced funding for the RSS Program for FFY2026 due to the reduced number of refugees expected by ORR to request RSS services in the State. ORR had advised that it has allocated "0" refugees to be resettled in the State. However, ORR has projected that there still may be up to 20 ORR eligible persons applying for RSS services (refugees from other states moving to Hawai'i, trafficking victims, etc). ORR has indicated that it will provide funding to the RCMA program but not to the same level.

Hawai'i normally receives minimal base funding which is approximately \$25,000. OCS has been advised that any cuts to RCMA funding will not go below that base amount. Currently, Hawai'i's RCMA program has about \$8,400 in carryover funds from FFY2025. ORR has advised that if more funding is required for the RCMA program the State may amend its budget at any time to request additional funding.

**E. Budget Development Process & Prioritization**

The department adhered to the FY27 Supplemental Budget Policies and Guidelines and submitted a steady-state budget considering the nature of its funding and federal funding uncertainty. The DLIR budget process utilizes a "bottom-up" approach. Each program is requested to review their current operational activities and identify resources needed to adequately provide the required statutory services to the public at acceptable levels. All program findings are then reviewed by the Director and appropriate staff to develop the department's final budget.

Requests for additional funds are prioritized based on factors that include, but are not limited to, the following: service levels to the public, State and Federal legal mandates, and modernization efforts to increase efficiency and transparency for workers, employers and beneficiaries.

## **F. Significant Adjustments**

The DLIR does not have any significant adjustments in the Governor's Executive Supplemental Budget request. The department has a minor request involving a trade off and one involving a transfer to accommodate the intent of Act 302 (SLH, 2025), which transferred the State Fire Council and State Fire Marshall to the Department of Law Enforcement for administrative purposes on July 1, 2025:

- Transfer \$318,000 (\$118,000 A funds: \$106,000 for contract services, \$12,000 for travel, and \$200,000 B funds for the Reduced Ignition Propensity Cigarette Program) pursuant to Act 302, and
- Transfer of \$134,350 A funds from the Personal Services category to the Other Current Expenses category to pay for current and ongoing expenses for Unemployment Insurance Division program operations.
