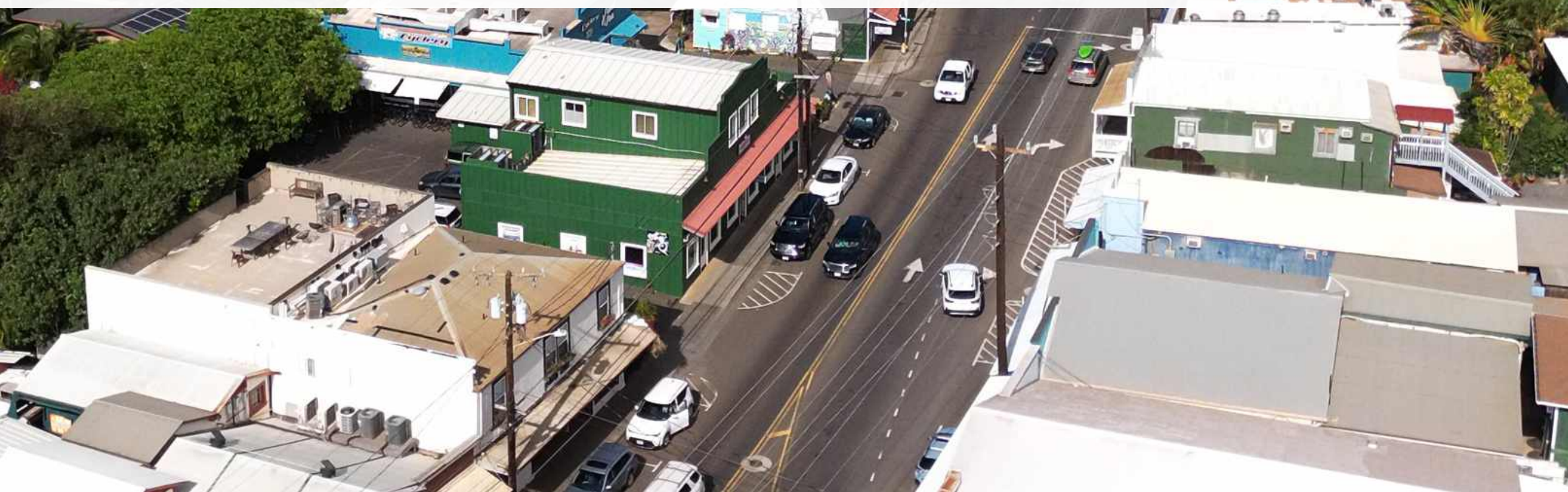
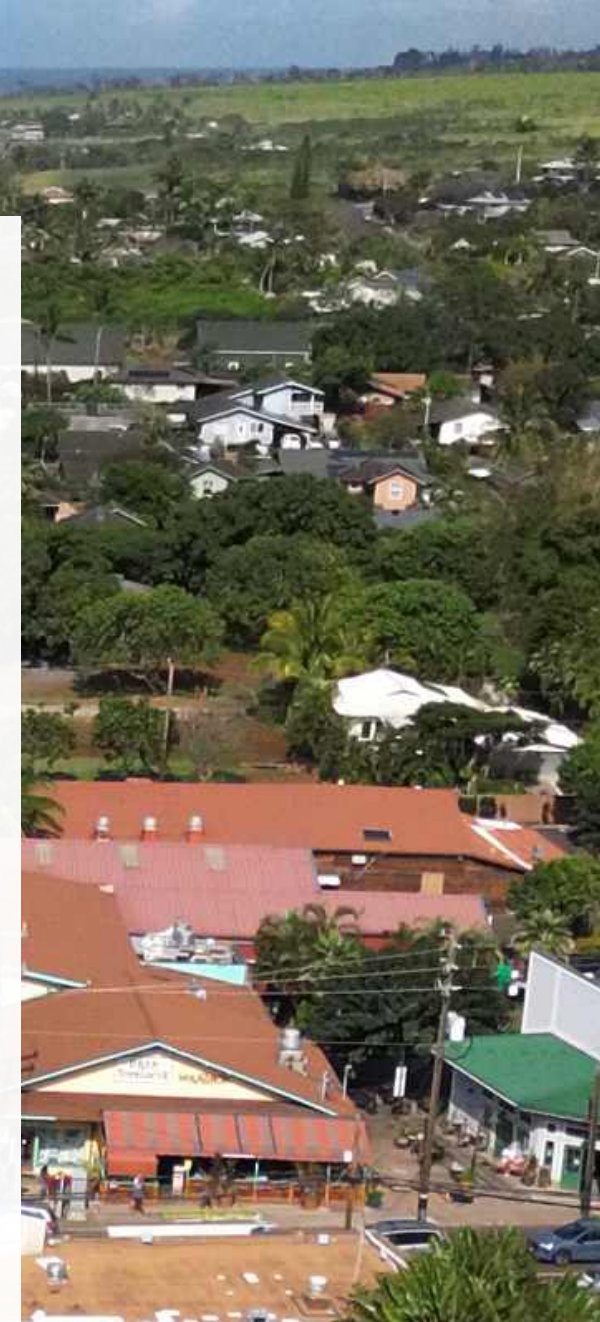

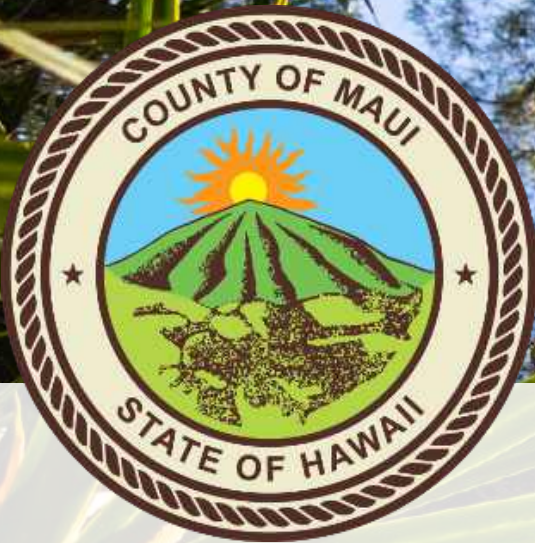
Infrastructure Improvements

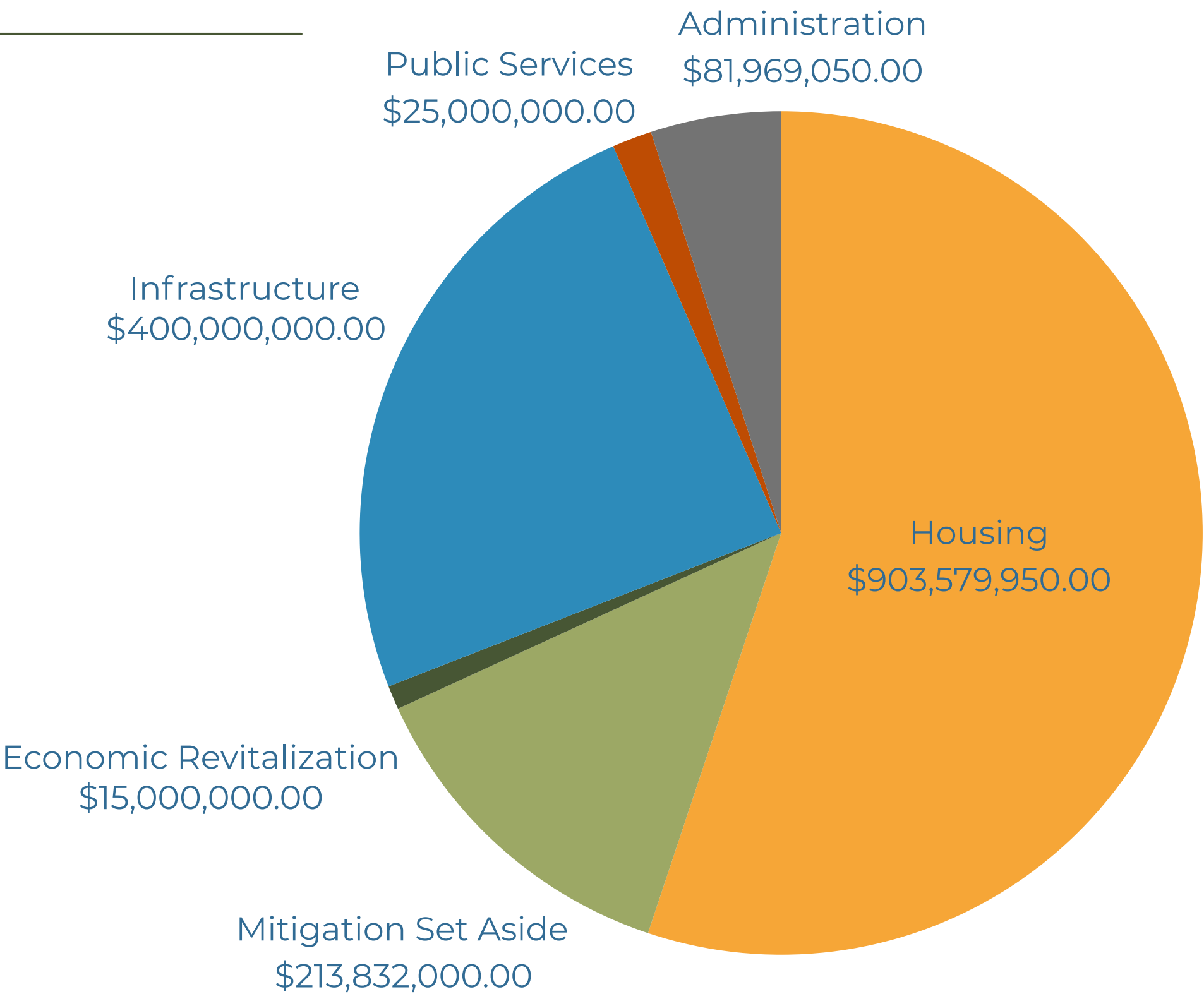

How CDBG-DR (Disaster Recovery) funds recovery projects:

Funding to programs is guided by HUD national objectives through a community-led, CDBG-DR Action Plan.

**CDBG-DR funds: \$1,639,381,000
allocated by program**

Wildfire debris cleanup completed

- ✓ Temporary debris storage site secured and constructed
- ✓ Over **400,000 tons of debris removed** from burn area
- ✓ Permanent debris site secured and constructed
- ✓ Debris transferred to permanent site
- ✓ Temporary site closed and restored
- ✓ Cleanup complete

From recovery to readiness

Re-opening of Lahaina Harbor

- Lahaina Small Boat Harbor reopened
- Harbor and surrounding County streets reopened daily from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m
- Initial commercial operators resumed service last month, with additional operators expected in coming months

Expedited recovery permitting for Lahaina residential rebuilds

- **334 total permits**
 - 172 residential
 - 162 non-residential
- Applications submitted and under review

Issued

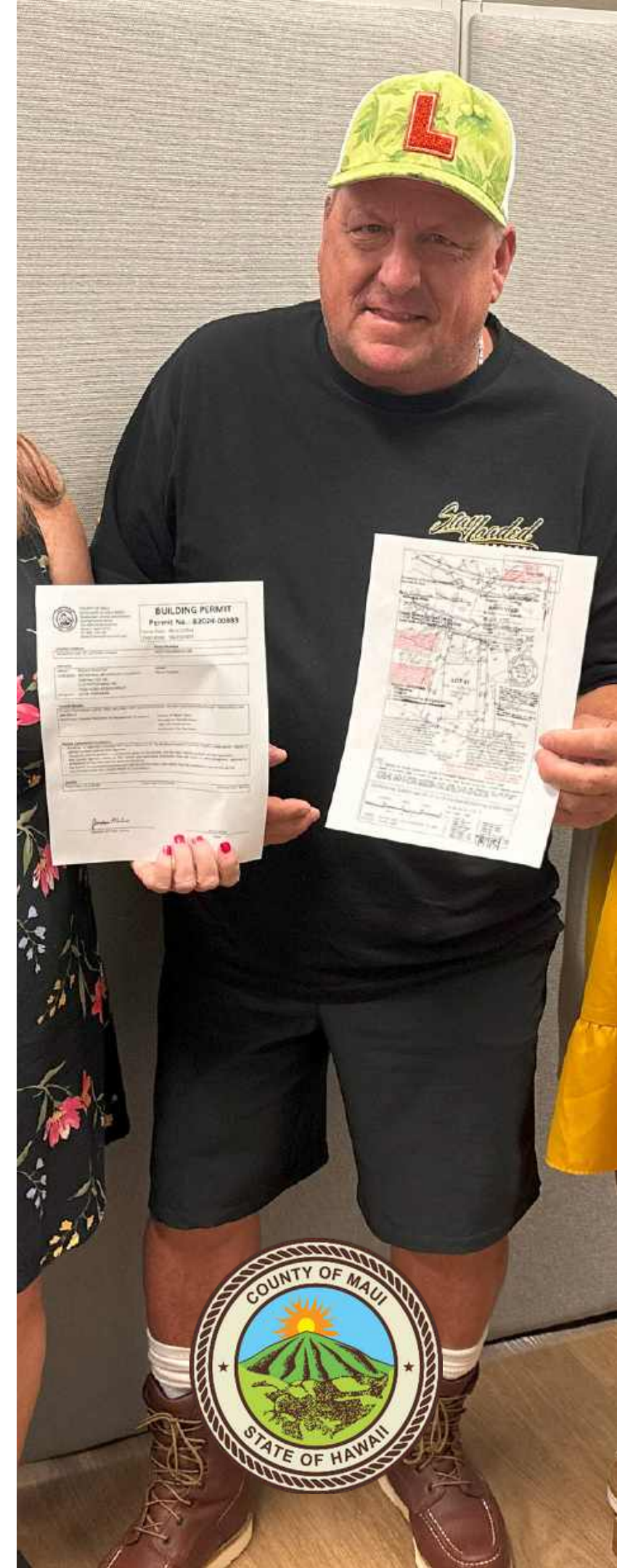
- **559 total permits**
 - 532 residential
 - 27 non-residential
- Permits issued; construction authorized to begin

Completed

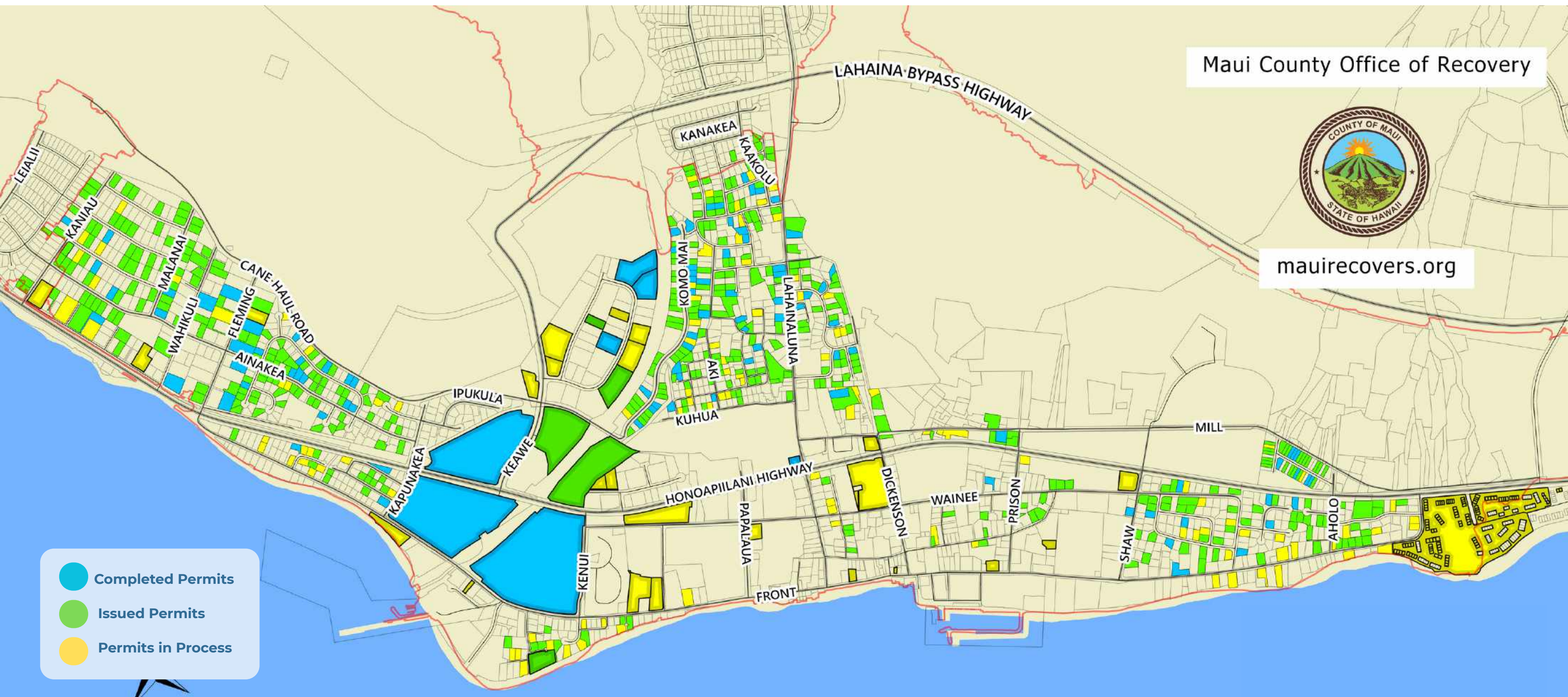
- **122 total permits**
 - 114 residential
 - 8 non-residential
- Final inspection passed

Average expedited permit approvals: 60 days

Ho'okumu Hou Housing Program

Ho'okumu Hou is a comprehensive housing recovery initiative designed to keep our people home.

- First-Time Homebuyer Opportunity Program (HOP)
- Single-Family Reimbursement Program
- Single-Family Reconstruction Program
- Multi Family Reconstruction Program

Launching soon:

- New Single-Family Construction Program
- New Multi Family Construction Program



Ho'okumu Hou Housing Program

First-Time Homebuyer Opportunity Program (HOP)

This program offers up to \$600,000 to help eligible households buy and live in a Maui County home

- 2,946 applications received

Funding: \$92.5 million obligated

Ho'okumu Hou Housing Program

Single-Family Reconstruction Program

This program will rebuild eligible local families' primary homes destroyed by the wildfires.

- 177 applications received to date

Housing designs for rebuilds

12 designs available



Ho'okumu Hou Housing Program

Reimbursement Program

Eligible homeowners who lived on their property as their primary residence at the time of the Maui wildfires can receive up to \$400,000 in reimbursement to help offset rebuilding costs.

- 142 applications received to date

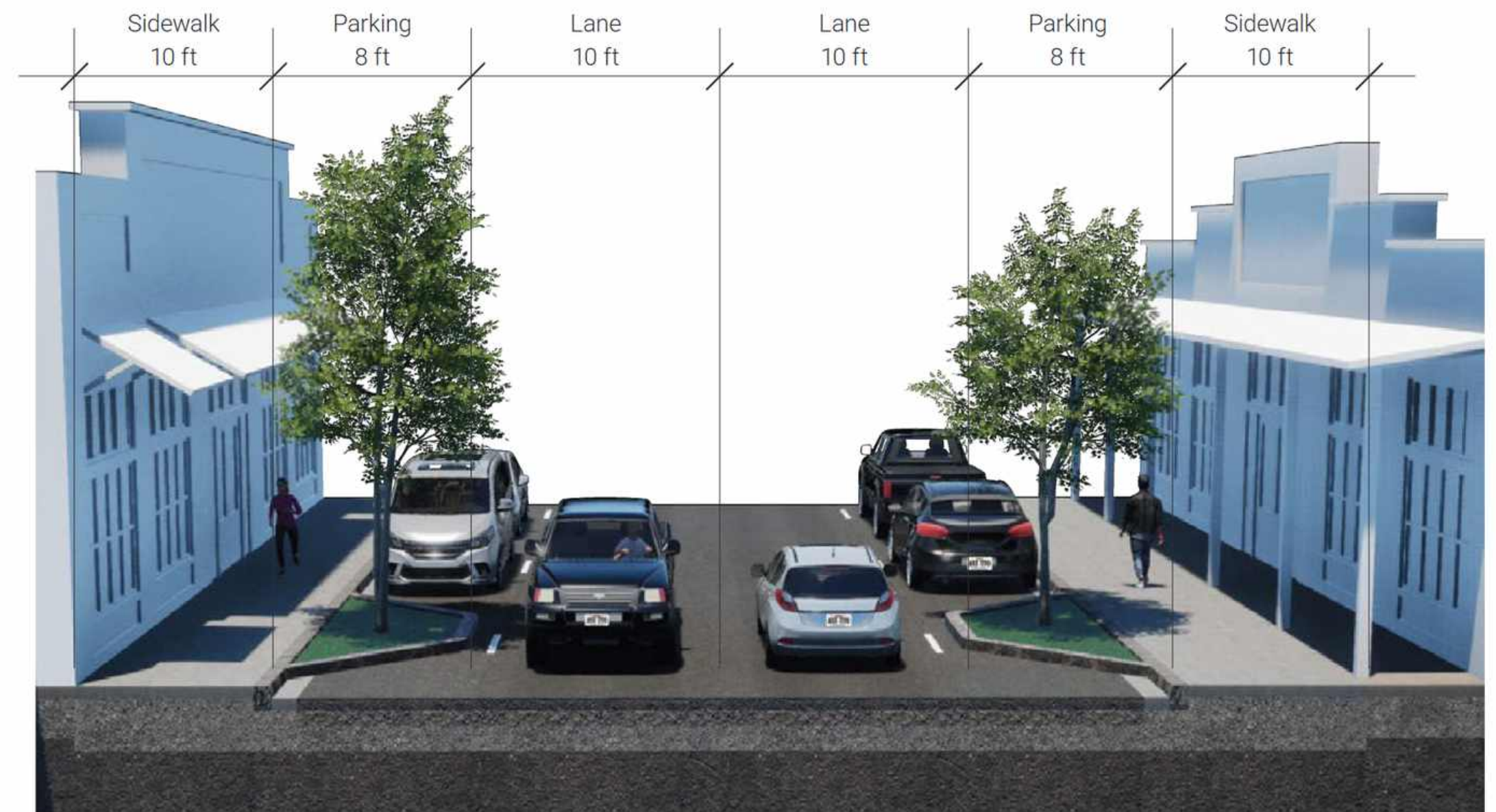

Wildfire mitigation

- **Targeted wildfire mitigation**
 - 801 County-managed parcels assessed, totaling 17,239 acres
 - 35 highest-risk parcels identified, totaling 926 acres, including critical infrastructure corridors
- **Coordinated County investment with MEMA, MFD, Recovery, and state DLNR and DOFAW**

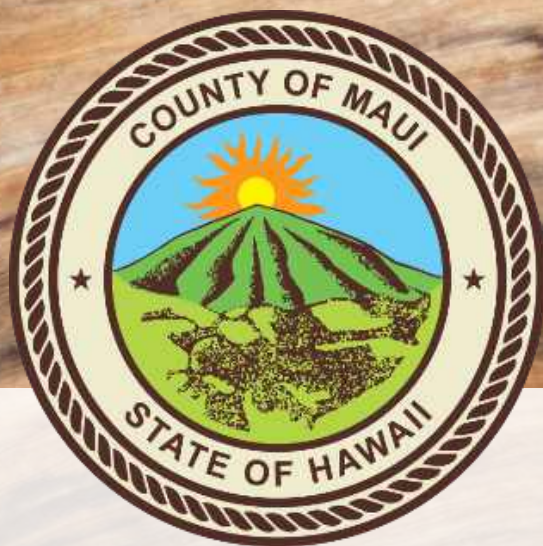

(projected for new and recovery rebuilds 2026-2030)

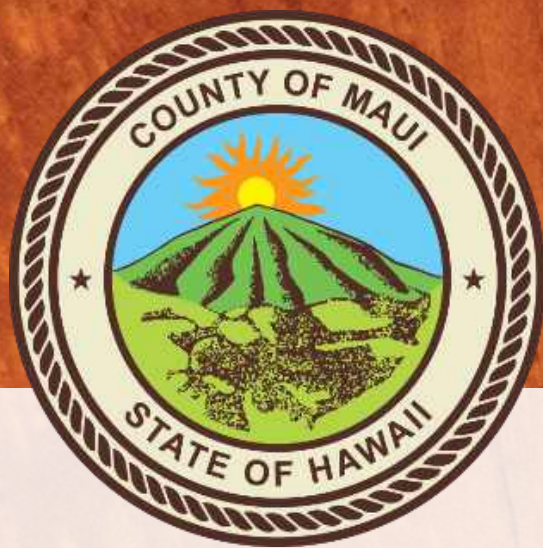

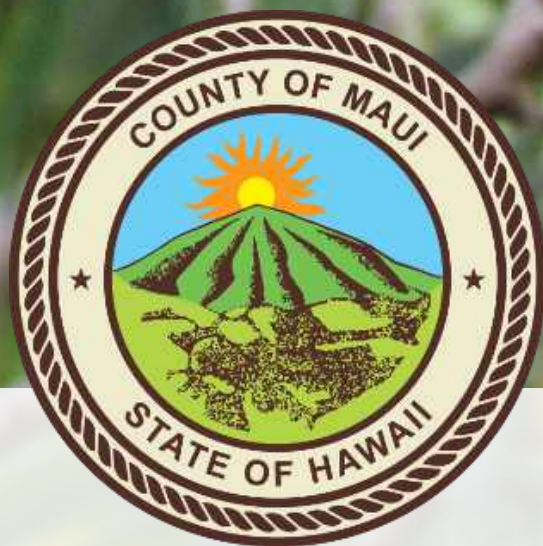
Central Maui Wastewater Reclamation Facility - Design Completion

- **Request: \$10.5 million**
 - Finishing the design phase
 - Project remains critical to Central Maui's growth, housing development, and long-term wastewater capacity

Workforce Stability: Retiree Rehire Authority (HCOM Package)

- Authorizes the temporary rehiring of retired public employees in critical positions
