Pakalolo's Long History, Regulated Future In Hawaii

Despite Hawaii's centuries-old appreciation for medicinal marijuana, dispensaries coming on line later this year are unlikely to make access and affordability better for patients.

Pakalolo is the Hawaiian word for cannabis and it literally means "numbing tobacco." The chronicled use of cannabis in the Hawaiian Islands, appearing in the Hawaiian Language Newspaper *Ka Nonanona*, goes as far back as the year 1842 – though cannabis use probably goes back much further. Advertisements for medical cannabis continued in Hawaiian newspapers throughout the 19th century.

Godlewski: SLU's program was the first of its kind in St. Louis. In 2018, BeLeaf, a well-known cultivator, manufacturer, and advocate in the St. Louis area was aware of our online programming and the success we recently had with a new craft brewing program. Since Missouri was about to go medically legal, there was a need to provide education to the industry's emerging workforce. University leadership worked with the BeLeaf team to determine the educational plan that would best prepare students to join the cannabis industry.



In Spring 2023, it was named the outstanding program of the year by the University Professional and Continuing Education Association (UPCEA). The award recognizes outstanding professional continuing education programs.




Godlewski: The Cannabis Sciences and Operations (CSO) program is comprised of six courses: Cannabis Fundamentals, Cannabis Plant Sciences & Cultivation, Cannabis Extraction & Product Production, Cannabis Compliance & Dispensing, Pharmacological Properties of Cannabis, and Cannabis Law & Entrepreneurship. All courses are taught by industry experts who are currently working in the industry in managerial roles or higher. We also have nurses, doctors, and lawyers who specialize in cannabis and CBD usage teaching courses.


Godlewski: Both education and careers are in high demand. Many students seek out our program because it is flexible, online, and taught by industry experts across the nation.

Job postings in the cannabis industry see thousands of applicants. Our students have a step up in the industry when they apply with a cannabis certificate from an accredited university that has a program taught by industry leaders. Educating this emerging industry has been a key factor to legitimizing the industry and its employees.

Since its launch in 2020, the Cannabis
Science program has been one of the most
successful in its college, drawing students
from across the United States (US).






The Elevations Lounge is a safe and sophisticated space for community members to partake in cannabis, discover curated products, wind down, or recharge.
