





Key Features of State Cannabis Regulation Laws

- Medical Cannabis Preserving & expanding access
- Small, Local Businesses Creating opportunity for small businesses and to transition legacy operators
- Public Health, Public Education, and Public Safety lab testing, labeling, consumer education, childproof packaging
- **Being Realistic** Excessive tax rates, unnecessarily onerous rules, & local bans can hamstring legal businesses
- Intoxicating Hemp Regulations with a unified regulator
- Investing in Social Equity, Youth, and Communities
- Stop Derailing Lives avoiding re-criminalization, include state-initiated expungement, & non-discrimination



Regulating Cannabis & Protecting Youth

- 19 of 21 legalization states with before-and-data have seen decreases in high schoolers' current marijuana use.
- Nationwide, high schoolers' marijuana use rates & reports of very or fairly easy availability have *dropped* since 2012.
- Surveys show near universal compliance with ID checks.



Growing the Economy and Investing in Youth & Communities

- States have generated over \$20 billion in cannabis taxes, and over \$4 billion in 2023 alone.
- Hawai'i can expect more than \$50 million in adult-use cannabis taxes per year & >5,000 new cannabis jobs.
- Tourism increased in Colo. and Calif. post-legalization.
 - California tourism broke records in '19 and again in '24.

"Cannabis legalization can bring in millions of dollars in tax revenue to states, and in some cases has already generated, or is expected to generate, hundreds of millions in revenue annually. States can decide where to direct that revenue from taxes and many are using a portion of it to support youth development, afterschool, and summer programs."
