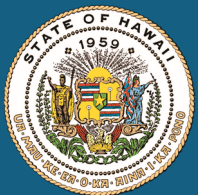

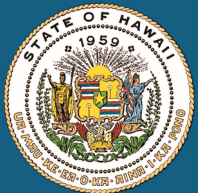


Functions

ISC has 3 main functions:

- **Pretrial assessments/reports**
 - Ohio Risk Assessment System –Pretrial Assessment Tool (ORAS-PAT)
- **Pretrial supervision**
 - ORAS Community Supervision Tool (risk/needs assessment)
 - Case Planning
- **Facility intakes**

Various screening tools to assist medical and security staff with proper housing and management of inmates



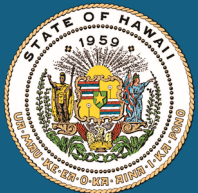

Hawai'i Revised Statutes (HRS) 804-4 Bail and Supervised Release

ISC staff follow national standards set forth in the National Association of Pretrial Services Agencies' guidelines, which state that release decisions should favor the least restrictive non-financial condition(s) to reasonably assure court appearance and public safety.

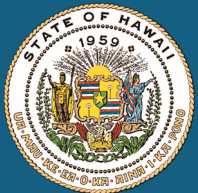


Pretrial Diversion Programs



- Partnership with **Criminal Justice Research Institute** to better inform pretrial practices statewide
- Specialty programs: Participation in regularly held meetings to strengthen partnerships impacting **Jail Diversion and SUDA-Fast** (Substance Abuse Disorder Assessment-Fast, Oahu)
- Internal collaboration with the Reentry Office to collaborate on resources **for clean and sober housing and peer navigators**
- ISC funds for **substance abuse treatment** contracts

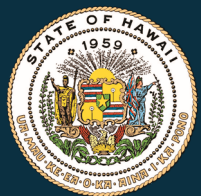

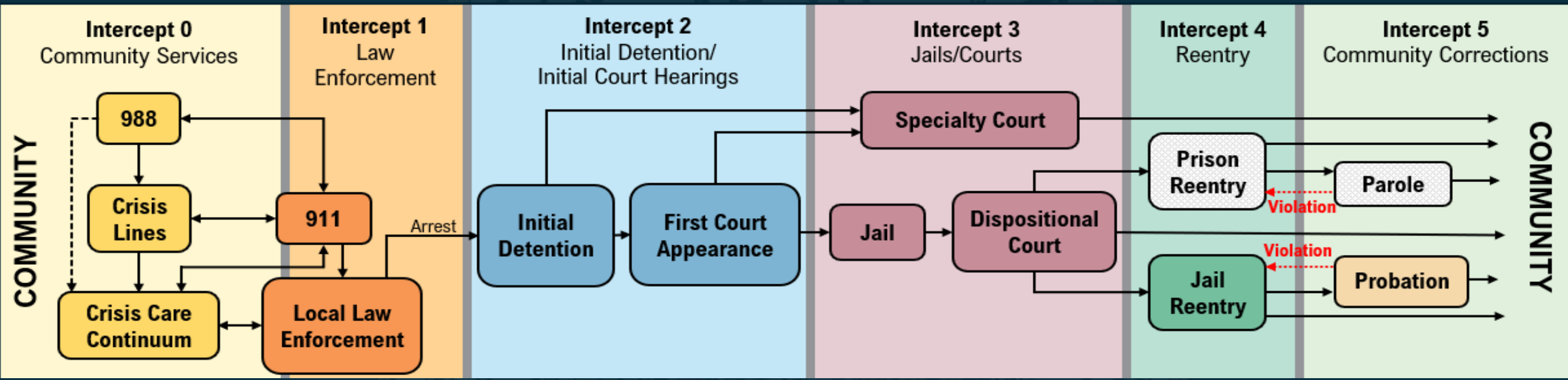

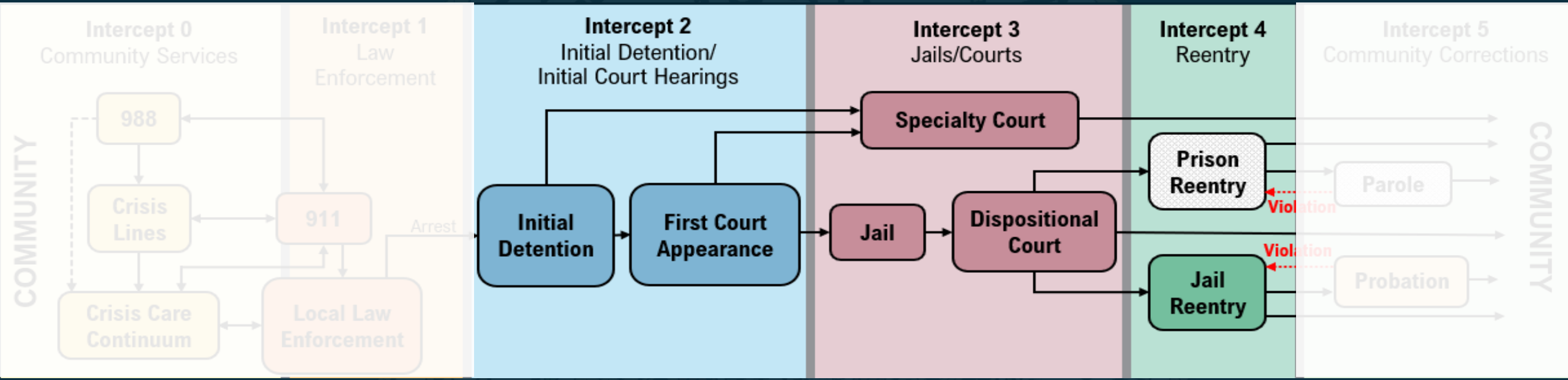
Sequential Intercept Model (SIM) Overview



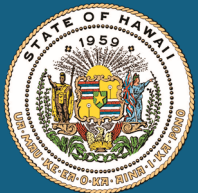


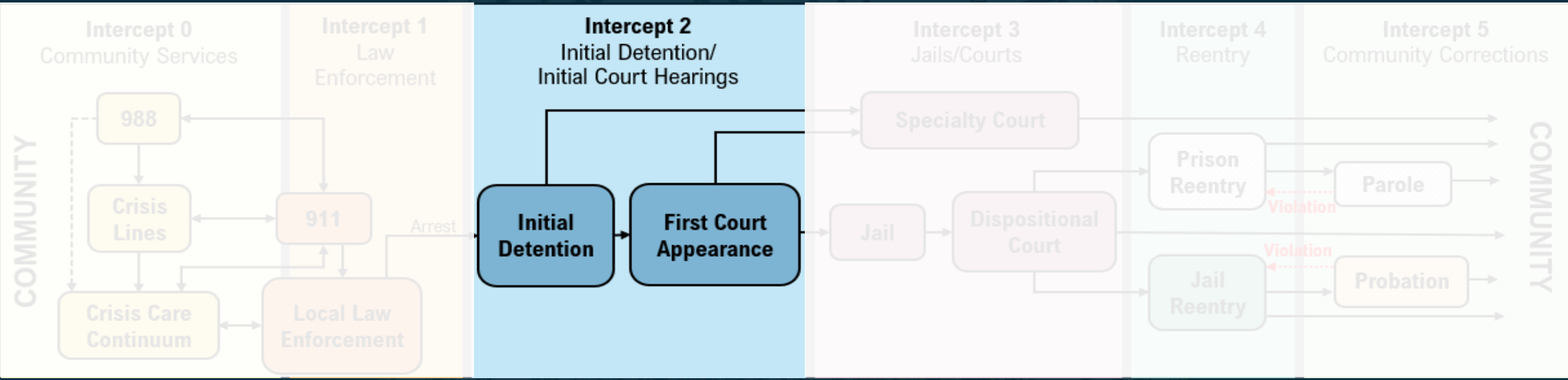

Pretrial Charge Severity



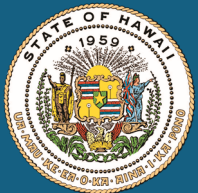
