A brief history of Halawa Facility

- Halawa originally opened as the Honolulu City and County Jail in 1962.
- In 1977, Halawa High Facility (Special Needs Facility) was transferred from the City to the State of Hawaii.
- The Medium Security Facility was opened in 1987.
- As the largest prison in Hawaii, Halawa usually holds between 700 to 800 inmates. As a prison, they are primarily convicted felons.
- There are approx. 200 uniformed officers and around 100 non-uniformed employees who work at Halawa.

Halawa has 3 main buildings

Administration Building:

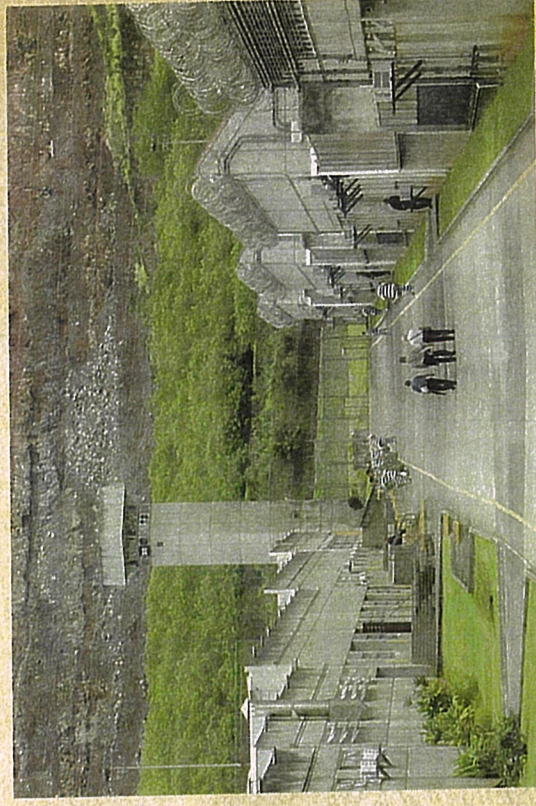
- Administration offices, Records, Staff Services, Business office, etc.
- Special Holding.

Left Side of the Main Street:

- Operations
- Kitchen and Dining Halls
- Programs (Chapel, Library, Education, & Gym)

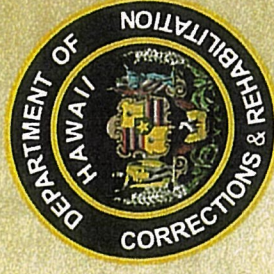
Right Side of the Main Street:

- Medical Unit.
- Housing Units (Module 1 – 4).

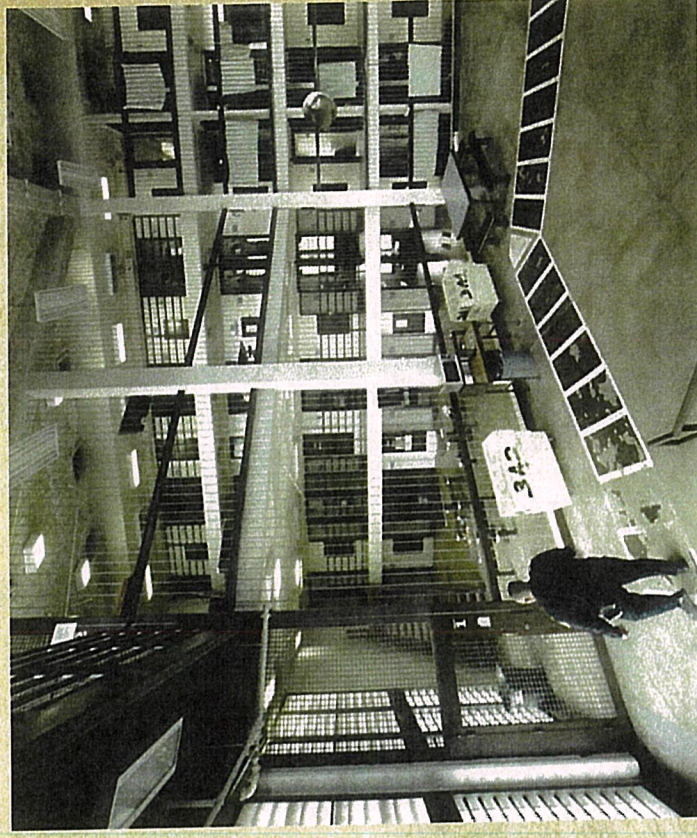
HALAWA CORRECTIONAL FACILITY

Housing Medium Module Units

- Halawa has 4 Medium Modules
- Each Modules has 2 blocks (A & B).
- Modules have 4 Levels or "tiers":
- Each block is separated into 4 quads.
- Each quad has 15 or 16 cells.

246 Inmates per Module

- 2 inmates per cell (bunk bed).
- 2 cells on A block designated for ADA inmates.
- Quad 3 on A block designated with ADA showers.

HALAWA CORRECTIONAL FACILITY

Education, Rehabilitation, Programming:

- Halawa offers GED and continuing education classes.
- Cognitive Skills teach better decision making.
- Inmates receive substance and alcohol abuse treatment.
- Sex Offenders attend relapse prevention.
- Programming is tailored to needs of the individual.

Vocational opportunities and training:

- Inmates are allowed to work in diverse roles.
- They earn money that can be used to buy commissary.
- Some money is set aside for victim restitution.
- Programs in culinary and forklift operator are available.





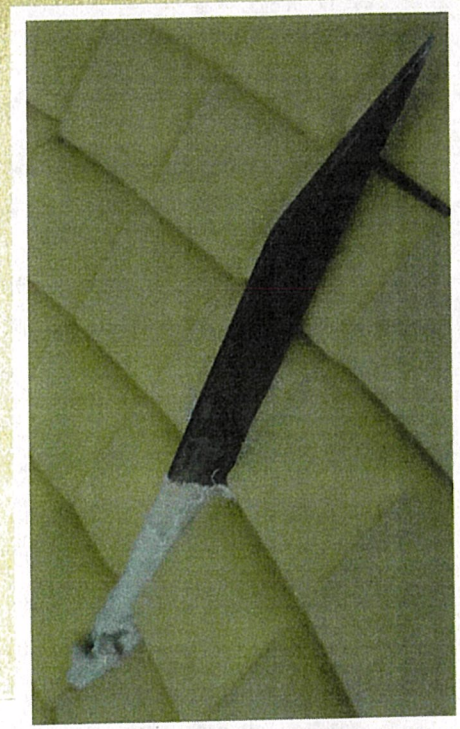

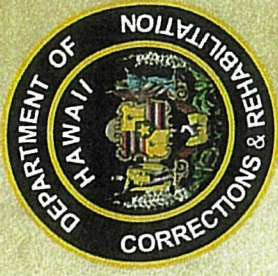
Officers conduct searches to remove contraband:

- Can range from cigarettes, drugs, cell phones, currency, and weapons.
