



7. What pre-travel notifications are currently being utilized to make travelers aware of the new procedures at or before the travel date?
7. What other specific notifications, if any, are being considered?

In addition to the questions around travel regulations the committee has some remaining follow-ups with the department stemming from previous briefings. During our August 6, 2020 briefing with the department it was discussed that pursuant to the grant application submitted to the Center for Disease Control (CDC), certain metrics were required to be collected and submitted to the CDC. At that time the committee identified those same metrics as being beneficial information to the public at large, and requested that they be included in the metrics being made publicly available. It is our assumption that the department is in compliance with its CDC grant requirements and is collecting this data. We once again ask that the department make the following data available to the committee and public:

1. Test to result lag;
2. Test to investigation lag; and
3. Investigation to contact of close contact (tracing) lag.

The Committee requests that you provide documentation of the requested information by **4:00 pm, Friday, October 2**. Please email your response to all Senate Special Committee COVID-19 members.
