










Tariffs and Hawaii Exports

April 2: Trump declares "Liberation Day with tariffs on 180 countries

August 1: Liberation Day tariffs take effect, amounts vary wildly by country, and still changing.



Macadamia Nut Growth Outlook



Based on the data above, Hawaii's world market share is expected to drop from 4.34% to 1.79% between 2024 and 2029. Among the world's nine commercially producing areas, Hawaii currently ranks seventh. By 2029, Hawaii is expected to drop to no. 8.

Mac Nut Tariff Overview

China Tariff

- Australia nuts, range from zero to 5%
- Hawaii nuts 22% tariff
 - 50% of Hawaii nuts historically go to China

Canada Trade

- No tariff on macs but strong aversion to US-grown products
 - o 2025 Sales down 32% over same period in 2024

US Mainland Trade

- Foreign Kernel 30% cheaper, impacting Hawaii growers significantly
- Doubling of input costs for packaging
- Snack Market is tanking, slowing imports and usage of macs
 - o In effect, diverting sales into a crowded global market

Coffee Tariff Overview

Overall Market

- Coffee is a staple foodstuff, AND a luxury good.
- Incoming tariffs and Brazil drought driving record C-Market prices
 - Retail commodity pricing doubling or tripling
 - Roasters have smaller budgets for rare beans such as Hawaii

Retaliatory Tariffs

- Canada: 25% on green coffee
- China: 22% on green and roasted

Timing of Sales

- Hawaii harvest just now coming available, full impact is pending.
- Hesitancy by wholesalers to book 12 month contracts
- Mainland industry worth \$343 billion, lobbying hard against tariffs

Bottom Line

Trade policy is defining the future of premium agricultural exports. While Hawaii farmers face headwinds from tariffs and limited growth, other countries are scaling up, entering new markets, and reaping the rewards of smart policy alignment.

USDA FAS Funding for Hawaii Crops

- Generic annual funding for overseas marketing and promotional activities that help build commercial export markets for U.S. ag
- SHAC is an official Cooperator
 - ALL Federal funds must be spent on activities
 - Requires a 10% cash plus 40% in-kind copay
- Regional Ag Promotion Program (RAPP): Activities through 2030
 - \$1.35 million for Taiwan, Dubai, Japan, South Korea marketing
 - Coordination with DBEDT and HDAB
- USDA FAS Market Access Program 2025: activities through 2025:
 - \$210,000 for China, Taiwan and Canada

USDA and **USAID** Funding

Twice frozen but now cleared

- USDA NIFA Specialty Crop Research Initiative: Coffee Leaf Rust response research through August 2026
 - \$2.6 mil approx. remaining

USAID RIP: But still fighting to find a home for R&D

- USAID: Soil fertility in Hawaii and Guatemala killed
 - \$500,000 to SHAC and ARS PBARC for Year One of Five
- USAID/Cornell University Crop Improvement Innovation Lab killed
 - o \$6 million for Breeding Improvements on CLR resistant trees
- RFP USAID Innovation Lab on Perennial Crops was due in March: killed
 - \$5 million potentially to UH for Coffee and Cacao research
