




The legislative session has reached its midway point and the major, "First Cross-Over" deadline where House and Senate bills switch sides for review from the opposite chamber. In addition to attending hearing on Senate bills, I will also be considering Resolutions.

With the help of students from Waipahu High School who shared research they did on crosswalks with me during a capitol visit, I was able take their findings to introduce **House Resolution (HR)** 32 and **House Concurrent Resolution (HCR)** 31 to urge the Department of Transportation to construct an all-way crosswalk or "pedestrian scramble" for the cross-streets of Kahualii Street, Waipio Point Access Road, and Farrington Highway.

I will be monitoring this and other resolutions along with the Senate bills that have been sent over to the House.
