New HONU Site at Old Stadium Park

The HONU Program (Homeless Outreach and Navigation for Unsheltered Persons) brings mobile shelter and support services directly into our communities. Set up in city parks for about 90 to 120 days at a time, each site offers up to 40 individuals a safe place to stay, along with meals, hygiene facilities, and guidance toward long-term housing solutions. This program is an important step in helping our unsheltered neighbors find stability and a path forward, while also promoting safety and compassion in our public spaces.
