Aloha Friends and Neighbors,

We now have less than thirty days remaining in the 2026 Legislative Session. At this stage, both the Hawaii State House of Representatives and the Hawaii State Senate are holding their final hearings as bills move toward “third reading,” the final vote in each chamber. Once passed, measures are sent back to their originating chamber.

When the House and Senate pass different versions of a bill, a conference committee is formed to reconcile those differences. Conferees from both chambers negotiate a final version, which must be approved without amendments before advancing to the Governor. If agreement is not reached, the bill fails.

Conference committees are often the most critical stage of the process, where final decisions are made. As always, I will continue to vote in alignment with our district's priorities and mahalo for your continued support and trust.
