As the 2026 Legislative Session comes to a close, I'm proud of what we accomplished in the House of Representatives. Of the thousands of bills introduced in January, more than 250 crossed the finish line — including important measures focused on supporting our kūpuna, easing the cost of living, strengthening education, improving public safety, protecting Hawai'i's environment and advancing good government reforms. I'm especially proud to have voted in support of the passage of SB2471, a historic piece of legislation aimed at limiting corporate money and outside influence in Hawai'i's elections.

I am also proud to help secure funding for important educational and community investments throughout our area, including facility improvements at Ala Wai Elementary, Kaimukī High School, Lunalilo Elementary and Washington Middle School, as well as funding for local organizations providing cultural, educational, youth, health, and community services throughout our district.

As we move into the interim, I remain committed to serving our community and continuing to work on strong, solutions-oriented legislation to introduce next session. Capital Improvement Projects

\$750,000 | Ala Wai Elementary School

Design and construction for library AC replacement and P3, P4 reroofing; Ground and site improvements; Equipment and appurtenances.

\$1,359,000 | Kaimukī High School

Design and construction for G102, G103 electrical upgrades, gym floor replacement, building Z dehumidifier installations, and building YY and Q structural damage repairs; Ground and site improvements; Equipment and appurtenances.

\$385,000 | Lunalilo Elementary School

Design and construction for A, B, C spalling repairs and railings, and building E reroofing; Ground and site improvements; Equipment and appurtenances.

\$1,980,000 | Washington Middle School

Design and construction for P1-P4 electrical upgrades and building F first and second floor restroom renovations; Ground and site improvements; Equipment and appurtenances.

SESSION 2026 HIGHLIGHTS

Supporting Kūpuna & 'Ohana

Senate Bill 2866 – State Rent Supplement Program for Kūpuna

Helps low-income kūpuna remain housed by extending the State Rent Supplement Program and supporting housing stability for seniors.

House Bill 1973 – Creation of the “KupunAloha Program.”

Establishes within the Department of Health a one-year KupunAloha Pilot Program to provide in-home health care and support services to eligible participants who do not otherwise qualify for government assistance for these services.

Senate Bill 3245 – Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

Simplifies and expands access to SNAP food assistance benefits for kūpuna and low-income households by extending eligibility certification periods, reducing paperwork and interview requirements, and improving long-term benefit stability for elderly and disabled residents.

Senate Bill 2861 – Kakou Pilot Program: Families and Children in Need

Establishes the proposed “Kākou Pilot Program” within the Office of Wellness and Resilience to provide additional support for vulnerable children and families across the state. The bill would utilize available federal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) funding to help provide services such as child wellness visits, food assistance, counseling and family support services, trauma-informed care, and assistance for families transitioning out of foster care placements.

Good Government Reform

Senate Bill 2471 – Artificial Persons / Campaign Spending Reform

Reaffirms that artificial persons created under state law possess only those powers that are necessary or convenient to carry out lawful purposes, and that those powers do not include the power to spend money or contribute anything of value to influence elections or ballot measures.

Supporting Our Teachers

House Bill 1890 – Public School Teacher Compensation and Retention

Provides annual salary step increases for public school and public charter school teachers who complete one year of satisfactory service and meet negotiated collective bargaining requirements. It also allows for additional longevity pay increases for teachers who remain in the profession long-term.
