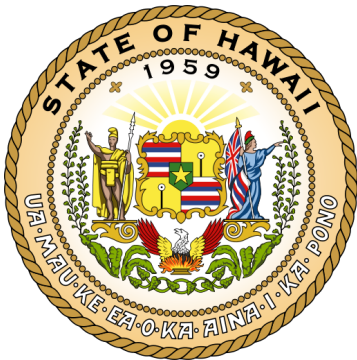


Aloha kākou,

This month, I hosted a working group to evaluate Wahiawā’s readiness to deal with natural disasters. We discussed the formation of a Hawai’i Hazards and Resilience Program for our district, which will help us become more self-reliant during and after natural hazard events, improve our ability to take care of our basic needs, and reduce the negative impact of disasters when they occur. If you would like to be part of this effort moving forward, please contact my office.

Additionally, I have received concerns about new development taking place at 1238 Kaala Ave. In 2013, LB Hui LLC, owned by the development firm GreeneWaters, purchased the 3.7-acre property for about \$1.6 million, according to public records, intending to build a 25-home housing complex on the site. My office is currently working with the Honolulu Mayor’s Office to determine if the current and future activities taking place at the site have received proper permitting.

I would like to say congratulations to Rooted Kekahi Me Ka`Āina (Rooted KMKA), a new non-profit in Whitmore Village that is working with the community to create an after-school farming

program for elementary and middle school children. While working to create a traditional farm buffer zone between our neighborhoods and the Whitmore Project, Rooted's members have engaged in community clean-ups, including recently repainting the Whitmore Ave. wall. Mahalo, Rooted!

Also, the 'Āina Project at Wahiawā Middle School, run by the Wahiawā Agricultural Association, just started its first sessions for 6th, 7th and 8th graders. This is an after-school aloha 'āina program that teaches middle school children about sustainable farming techniques. Mentors work closely with students to develop and implement plans for growing their own food. Senior members of the community (kūpuna) also help students connect Wahiawā's history to the importance of sustainable farming.
