Red Hill Water Alliance Initiative (WAI) Report

On November 28, 2023, the final report from the Red Hill Water Initiative (WAI) group was issued, advocating for aquifer remediation and an integrated approach to resolving the water crises. The formation of Red Hill WAI followed a joint declaration by State and City leaders on May 8, 2023, demonstrating a collective dedication to ensuring clean, safe water.

Queen Street Crosswalk and Kolowalu Dog Park

Our community has been anxiously awaiting the completion of two projects to enhance our neighborhood: the Queen Street crosswalk and the Kolowalu offleash dog park.

A permanent crosswalk, pedestrian refuge island, and rapid flashing beacons will replace the temporary crosswalk, signage, and pedestrian island located on Queen Street at Kolowalu Park. An off-leash dog park consisting of two separate sections for "large" and "small" dogs will be built at Kolowalu Park Mauka to include lighting, water, benches, and fences.

The Hawaii Community Development Authority (HCDA) is working on both projects and recently selected contractors for these projects. According to HCDA, construction began in 2023 and should be completed in early 2024. HCDA is working diligently to expedite these projects to completion. Raised Crosswalks on Pensacola Street

In December 2023, the Hawaii State Department of Transportation (DoT) installed four raised crosswalks along Pensacola Street between King Street and Kapiolani Boulevard. The raised crosswalks are located at the intersections of Elm, Rycroft, Hoolai, and Kamaile Streets.

The new raised crosswalks serve as effective traffic calming devices, contributing to a reduction in vehicle speed and improving driver stop compliance. They also aim to improve pedestrian visibility, which is crucial in the vicinity of McKinley High School. The tragic incident involving Sara Yara last year serves as a reminder of the importance of implementing proactive measures to ensure safe driving around our schools and other vulnerable community institutions.



Thank you to the many Sheridan-Ala Moana residents who contacted our office regarding the homeless encampments at Sheridan Park. This action would not have been made possible without your kokua and we appreciate your patience over the past months while we worked to resolve this issue between the business and our community. Law Enforcement Virtual Town Hall

Rep. Saiki was joined by the top federal, state, and city law enforcement officers in Hawaii for a Law Enforcement Virtual Town Hall. 
