We are halfway through 2023 and just about to begin our summer. As of June 7, 2023, Governor Green signed sixty-two bills into law including: SB731 (Act 11) designating November 28 of each year as *La Kuokoa*, Hawaiian Independence Day; HB1329 (Act 53) requiring DOE to work with organizations to develop and implement an active shooter training program in schools; and SB975 (Act 62) includes electronic smoking devices and e-liquid as tobacco products and requiring retailers of e-liquid to obtain a tobacco permit. You may find more information on these acts and a complete list on the <u>Hawaii State Legislature's website</u>. The last day for governor to inform the Legislature of his intent to veto is on June 26, 2023. Until then, please continue to connect with me and our office on what we can do to advance our community and state. As always, mahalo and God bless.



Ewa Makai Middle School











Proposal:


- Acquire 14.79 acres of land for construction of up to 142 residential units and associated infrastructure.
