List of Vetoed Bills

As of Wednesday, July 10, 2024, Governor Green had passed 253 bills to be acts (laws). Although many bills have been approved by the governor, he has also provided a list of 11 bills he vetoed. Please visit the <u>Hawai'i State Legislature's website</u> for more information.

H.B. 1633, H.D. 1, S.D. 1, C.D.1 Relating to Contractors.

Repeals the leasing restriction on owner-builders who obtain an owner-builder exemption to act as their own contractor and who build or improve residential or farm buildings or structures on their own property and do not offer the buildings or structures for sale.

S.B. 527, S.D. 2, H.D. 2 Relating to Biosecurity.

Authorizes and specifies condition under which the Department of Agriculture may declare a biosecurity emergency, during which the Department and Governor may take certain action to prevent establishment or spread of pests and prohibited or restricted organisms.

H.B. 1800, H.D. 1, S.D. 1, C.D. 1 Relating to the State Budget.

supplemental Appropriate funds for the operating costs of the Executive Branch for the fiscal biennium beginning on July 1, 2023 and ending on June 30, 2025. You may find more info on the governor's website.

Capitol Update

Press Conference- Chinatown Power Outages June 24, 2024

I held a press conference at the Hawai'i State Capitol due to the Chinatown power outages. Our local businesses and residents need our support to voice their concerns to those who need to be held accountable. I called upon Governor Josh Green and Hawaiian Electric to show their support and provide answers to our people affected by these outages.

Judicial Appointments June 27, 2024

The State Senate held its <u>2024 First Special Session</u> for four gubernatorial nominees: Rebecca Copeland, Brian Costa, Dyan Medeiros, and Steven Nichols. Governor's nominees were submitted for consideration and confirmation to the Circuit Court of the First Circuit, State of Hawai'i, with a term to expire in 10 years. All four nominees reported out of the JDC committee with majority in support. On the floor, each nominee also received a unanimous vote in support. Mahalo for all the hard work that you have done thus far, and may you all continue to carry on with the wisdom and knowledge you need to serve in your new capacity. Congratulations to all!









Bills to Laws

You may find the full list of Acts, as well as the status of other measures on the <u>Hawai'i State Legislature's</u> website under 'Reports and Lists' and 'Governor's Actions.'

S.B. 2601, H.D. 1, C.D. 1 (Act 250) Relating to Sexual Abuse of Minors.

Expands the time period by which a civil action for childhood sexual abuse committed on or after July 2024 may be initiated.

S.B. 2575, H.D. 1, C.D. 1 (Act 228) Relating to the Environment.

Prohibits the mining, extraction, and removal of minerals from the seabed in all state marine waters and issuance of any permit.

S.B. 2257, S.D. 3, H.D. 1, C.D. 1 (Act 151) Relating to Education.

Authorizes the Hawaiʻi Teacher Standards Board to consider qualified individuals with at least an associate's degree or H.S. diploma with comparable education and coursework, industry and content expertise to teach career and technical education courses.

S.B. 2079, H.D. 1, C.D. 1 (Act 196) Relating to the Importation of Plants and Animals.

Allows the State of Hawai'i Plant and Animal Declaration Form to be distributed, completed, and transmitted electronically.

S.B. 2819, S.D. 1, H.D. 2, C.D. 1 (Act 175) Relating to Traffic Safety.

Requires vehicles traveling ten miles or more below the posted speed limit with at least five cars are formed behind on a two-lane highway, to pull over to allow vehicles to pass.
