In the Community

Hawaiʻi Agriculture Research Center August 7, 2024



I had the pleasure of meeting with Wren Wescott from Longroad Energy and Julie, a researcher at the site I toured- Mahi Solar project-Hawai'i's first mixed-use agrivoltaic farming site. Agrivoltaics is the installation of solar panels on farmland while agricultural activities are done under and/or between the solar panels. There are two agrivoltaic projects: Mahi Solar (Kunia, O'ahu) and Pulehu Solar (Kula, Maui). The site I toured grew asparagus, blueberries, and mamaki tea, among other crops. It was quite an experience!



Sign Waving and Press Conference Over City Towing Contract

I hosted a sign waving event and held a press conference at the Honolulu Hale to urge the City Customer Services Department to terminate its current towing contract. I have sent a letter to Mayor Rick Blangiardi and the Department of our concerns as it must be addressed: the hookup fee is \$900 and the current towing contract has a company that does not have a solid waste management permit. For a towing contract to be valid, the company must have a solid waste management permit. All Island Towing does not have a permit, as I have verified this information with the Dept. of Health and requested that the contract be immediately void as they are not eligible to continue its towing contract.



Basketball Hawaii Youth Academy 2024 Summer Fest

The Basketball Hawaii Youth Academy held its 2024 Summer Fest at the West O'ahu Veterans Center in Iroquois Point. There were many activities at the festival: arts and crafts, food, games, music, and vendors. I was excited to join and participate in our community event. A portion of the collected proceeds was given to the special needs (keiki), veterans, and basketball players' programs.

Capitol Update

Governor's Emergency Proclamation August 7, 2024

As there has been an increase of condominium insurance throughout Hawai'i, Governor Green has released a <u>Proclamation Relating to Condominium</u> <u>Insurance Stabilization</u>. This proclamation is intended to help condo renters and owners to help alleviate financial hardship. The proclamation ends on October 6, 2024. Informational Briefing on the School Bus Route Shortages

August 15, 2024

The House committee on Education hosted an informational briefing to provide the committee and public of the updates on the state-wide school bus route shortages. Across Hawai'i, about 20% of our keiki attending DOE schools utilize buses. There is a downhill trend of the retention of our school bus drivers; as a result, routes have been discontinued. When discussion was up for discontinuing bus routes, factors such as: availability of public transit, population demographics, and school levels, were considered. Although it was mentioned that the contractors are able to cater to the students, despite limited drivers, the schools have adapted to the bus route shortages, as some schools begin at different times (7:30 and 8:15 a.m.) and positions in schools may allow the flexibility to drive school buses. Informational Briefing for Act 279 Working Group

August 15, 2024

The House of Representative's Act 279 Working Group held an informational briefing for the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands to provide an update of the funds appropriated in Act 279 (2022) and discuss any potential legislation to assist with utilizing the funds. <u>Updates for East Kapolei</u>: Kanehili has 404 lots with 99% occupied. Ka'ulukaha'i II (K. II) has six different divisions of residential lots that has some lots occupied (K. II-B), being developed (K. II-C), some not being constructed yet, (K. II- D, E, F), and some to be designated as low density apartments (K. II- A). You may <u>view the meeting</u> on YouTube.

EET, CPN, & WAM Site Visit

September 4, 2024

The Senate committees on Energy, Economic Development, and Tourism (EET), Commerce and Consumer Protection (CPN), and Ways and Means (WAM) attended a site visit on Maui. The Hawaiian Electric company (HECO) provided a tour for the legislators around its infrastructure and operations. The purpose of the visit was to provide the committees
