We are approaching the final weeks of the 33rd Legislative Session, and I am pleased to share some highlights of our work in the Senate. This session, I remained focused on legislation that supports our students, educators, and families. The nominees for the Board of Education, Hawai'i Teacher Standards Board, and School Facilities Authority were confirmed this month by my committee.

The Senate took time to recognize exemplary members of our community, including Blaine Miyasato for his 40 years of service and leadership at Hawaiian Airlines. Our very own District 18 Healthcare Hero, Trevor Fujisaka, was one of four recognized for his outstanding contributions to our community.

At the end of March, we welcomed the Portuguese Delegation to our State Capitol, including Ambassador Duarte Lopes and Consul General Ramalheira, as part of our continued efforts to strengthen international partnerships. This month, we also continued our annual tradition of giving back through our Easter Basket Drive organized by the Women's Legislative Caucus. Thanks to the generosity of our legislative 'ohana and community members, we were able to collect and distribute baskets filled with essential items to families in need.

Outside of the Capitol, we also had a busy and inspiring month of community engagement. I had the honor of attending the inaugural HHSAA girls flag football match, a historic moment for girls' athletics in Hawai'i. The energy and enthusiasm from the players and fans are incredible, and I'm confident this program will continue to grow and thrive across the state. Finally, I'm thrilled to share that Mililani Uka Elementary is celebrating its 50th anniversary this year! I worked with Principal Kardash last year to secure \$1.5 million in funding to improve the school's telecommunications infrastructure—an investment that will help students and teachers stay connected and supported in today's digital age.

Governor Josh Green was in attendance, executing the coin toss with a special Patsy T. Mink coin. We were also joined by the Vice Chair of the Board of Education, William "Bill" Arakaki, and Superintendent Keith Hayashi. HMSA Chief Financial Officer, Jenny Smith, and Government Relations Manager Walden Au were also in attendance. HMSA provided headgear for the girls' flag football program.

Hawai'i became the 12th state to officially sanction girls flag football. These young women have paved the way for future generations of female athletes. The inaugural match ended with Moanalua winning over Roosevelt.

The state tournament is on April 26. As the grandmother of a girls' flag footballer, I am incredibly proud of these girls paving the way for future generations. While the season is almost over, this is only the beginning for girls' flag football in Hawai'i!
