STUDENT DEBT RELIEF & HAWAII PROMISE SCHOLARSHIP

President Biden just announced his student loan forgiveness plan, which offer debt relief for countless individuals who have been saddled by student debt. The plan includes extending the student loan repayment pause until December 31, 2022; cancelling \$20K in student loan debt for Pell Grant recipients and \$10K for non-Pell recipients; improve the student aid system by creating a new repayment plan that caps monthly payments at 5% of the borrower's discretionary income; improving the Public Service Loan Forgiveness (PSLF) program by helping borrowers who have worked in the nonprofit sector, military, or in federal, state, tribal, or local government, receiving appropriate credit toward loan forgiveness; and forgiving loan balances after 10 years



of payments and covering borrowers' unpaid monthly interests. Head to whitehouse gov for a full list of details from the Biden administration. In addition to those efforts, the University of Hawai'i Community College's new Hawai'i Promise Scholarship program is offering free in-state tuition for qualified UHCC students in need of financial support to pay for college. Hawai'i Promise covers direct education costs—including tuition, fees, as well as an allowance for books and supplies. I was glad to join Dean Nathan Murata and the UH College of Education community for their College Wide Meeting at the Stan Sheriff center. It was a wonderful opportunity to hear Dean Murata share the accomplishments of the COE, its plans for the future as well as the success of its Grow Our Own program. I am proud to see how GOO has evolved and nurtured new educators to pursue their academic interests and to become the amazing teachers they are today. It was particularly heartening to hear Ke'elikōlani Middle School's 8th grade English teacher Brandon Galarita share his own experience and how the funding I started was instrumental in helping him become a teacher. I am so grateful to Brandon and the countless educators here in Hawai'i who give so much of their time, talents and hearts to our keiki. I also announced that I was able to double the funding for GOO to \$1.2M this year to attract more teachers like Brandon.







MILILANI SOLAR PLANT RENEWABLE ENERGY LAUNCH

I attended with Senator Donovan Dela Cruz the launch of O'ahu's first solar and battery storage project in our district at the Mililani Agricultural Park. Established by Clearway Energy Group, this is the first ever utility-scale solar-plus-storage project in the state. It will provide 39MW of clean, renewable energy. This makes significant strides forward towards our green energy goals, working to becomes less dependent on imported oil and decreasing our electricity bills in place of renewable energy.
