Red Light Cameras on Vineyard Blvd.

10 intersections in Honolulu have been chosen to have Red

Light Cameras installed including three on Vineyard Blvd. First at the intersection of Palama Street, second at the intersection of Liliha Street, and third at the intersection of Nuuanu Avenue.



DOT's warning period at the

Vineyard and Liliha intersection just ended on Dec. 9, 2022, so fines will now be given to anyone caught running a red light at this intersection.

No Right Turn On Red at Likelike Hwy. and School St.

Senator Kim was asked about the "No Right Turn on Red" sign during the September 2022 Alewa Neighborhood Board. Our office contacted HDOT in October, and they advised us HDOT will install No Right Turn on Red signs at intersections with a higher-than-average number of bicycle or pedestrian involved crashes. HDOT makes these decisions for pedestrian and vehicle safety, and not the legislature.

If you would like to have the signs removed, you need to contact HDOT at (808) 587-

2150 to make your case as they determine safety measures.

Senator Kim will ask DOT to look at what kinds o traffic mitigations can be put in to address the log jam this "no right turn is causing during peak traffic hours.
