The State of Hawaii 31st Legislature's Update



Grow Hawai'i Awardees Site Visit: Zhao Produce and Island Farms

The members of the Ways and Means Committee were given the opportunity to visit a couple of the farms that benefited from the awards that were given through the Hawai'i Department of Agriculture, Grow Hawai'i Agriculture Initiative 2021. This program aimed at helping established local agricultural enterprises to swiftly scale up production and increase the state's gross domestic product. The program received funding from the Hawai`i State Legislature in 2020.

The award criteria were based on agricultural operations that have demonstrated business success and were in need of urgent funding to expand their commercial production and that have established business models that can effectively contribute to the growth of agriculture in the state.

This initiative is a collaboration with the University of Hawai'i-Manoa College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources.

We visited Zhao Produce and Island Farms to learn how the \$250,000 awards were utilized and the impacts the funding had on their respective expansion efforts. The farmers shared with us their successes and challenges with their operations.
