

2024 Legislative Priorities

EDUCATION



- Funding for improvement and construction of school facilities
- Addressing teacher shortages through programs such as dedicated affordable housing
- Incorporate cradle to career pathways for students to secure a job after high school/college graduation
- Introducing legislation to make Hawaiian language a requirement for students graduating from a DOE high school

PROTECTING NATURAL RESOURCES



- Prevent overuse of potable fresh water by tracking developments in the community and recreational water use
- Supporting legislation to limit water usage during water shortages
- Advocate for bills preventing deep sea mining of minerals
- Monitor and track possible threats to the environment such as treatment plant leaks and the Red Hill shut down

CLEAN & SAFE COMMUNITY

- Supporting programs to prevent recidivism, promoting re-entry and second chance assistance
- Investing in training to address the mentally ill and homeless
- Advocate for and introduce legislation to prevent aerial fireworks from entering the state through a complete ban
- Continue to participate in community cleanups

- Support local agricultural productions to move towards food sustainability and economic diversification
- Endorse legislation supporting Made in Hawaii initiatives
- Continuing to support local mom and pop shops

HEALTH

- Assisting persons with mental illness and destigmatizing mental illness
- Addressing shortage of health care workers, including doctors, physicians assistants, nurses, and social workers

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- Introduce and advocate for waste to energy technology to increase the State's production of energy and decrease the use of landfills
- Develop technological infrastructure to support economic diversification
- Advocating for and supporting career pathways into rising economic sectors for sustainable economic growth
