JTF-RED HILL DEFUELING UPDATE

Sen. Kim attended a meeting yesterday with

Navy Adm. Aquilino--Commander of the U.S. Indo-Pacific Command and a small group of Hawaii leaders. We received a final update on Red Hill Defueling



ahead of the Oct. 16 defueling.

- Defueling will be done Mon. Sat., starting Oct. 16.
- 99% of the fuel (100+M gal) up to the 10ft mark will be removed by end of Nov. (about 6 weeks)
- 2M gal. will remain and pumped out by 3rd • week in Jan. (7weeks)
- 64,184 gal. (sludge) to be removed by end of • April (13 weeks)
- 4,000 gal. residual fuel will remain. Removal will be dealt with as part of the Red Hill closure effort.

The Federal EPA and Hawaii Dept. of Health (DOH) approved the Navy Joint Task Force -Red Hill pre-defueling preparedness report. DOH has conditionally approved the Navy's plan. See: https://www.epa.gov/newsreleases/ epa-approves-joint-task-force-red-hill-pre-

Problem with Feral Chickens?

The Feral Chicken Working Group's first meeting was held on August 17, 2023. We learned that the City is now working with Sandwich Isle Pest Solutions to fund a portion of the cost to private property owners to catch and dispose of feral chickens. The next working group meeting is targeted next month. The working group's membership consist of State and City agencies. They are charged with collaborating on effective ways to address the Feral Chicken issues and submit a report to the Legislature no later than 30 days before the 2024 Legislative Session.
