

2020 ELECTION DATES

Beginning with the 2020 Elections, Hawaii votes by mail and all voters will automatically receive their ballot in the mail 18 days prior to each election.

Primary Election Ballot Delivered: July 21, 2020

Primary Election: August 8, 2020

General Election Ballot Delivered: October 16, 2020

General Election: November 3, 2020

FACE COVERING REQUIREMENTS EXPANDED FOR CERTAIN INDOOR AND OUTDOOR AREAS



The amended Restore Honolulu requires everyone on Oahu to wear face coverings over their noses and mouths at indoor public spaces and outdoor areas where physical distancing is unlikely or difficult to maintain. The wearing of face coverings under this Order is intended to complement, not serve as a substitute, for physical distancing and cleanliness.

Face masks will be required in private offices when people aren't working alone or sitting at a desk. They will also be required in outdoor spaces that have a lot of foot traffic — such as crowded sidewalks or in lines outside of stores.

SATELLITE CITY HALLS REOPEN TO THE PUBLIC; ROAD TESTS RESUME

Satellite city halls across Oahu reopened July 1 for regular in-office service on an appointment-only basis. Customers and employees will be required to wear facial coverings and remain six-feet apart from others during all in-office transactions.

Scheduled road tests are resuming, starting July 6. Customers whose appointments were cancelled, between March 23 and July 5, are being called directly to reschedule their appointments. Acceptance of new appointments will be announced at a later date.
