
2. Which departments have taken advantage of the technical assistance that the RCUH offers to help with federal grant application?

To date, we have not found grants that require RCUH assistance.


The federal government has introduced two methods for funding allocation to the states for coronavirus federal aid, (1) through expanding existing funding sources and additional flexibilities and (2) through new grants and programs.

Departments with "expansion" grants have the capability to monitor and complete the applications. There are few "new" grants/programs, none of which have required RCUH assistance.

A list of grants that will allow state employees to be paid by federal grants when redeployed to another program covered by federal COVID monies.
