The Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation (HART) and Kiewit advises residents, businesses and commuters in the Waipahu area that construction equipment used to build the overhead guideway along Farrington Highway will be removed during the coming weeks.

This work will take place in phases and includes the installation of the last segments of guideway in the Farrington Highway section of the project.


TRAFFIC PLANS:

TRAFFIC PLANS FOR GUIDEWAY INSTALLATION

Intersection of Farrington Highway at Mokuola Street and Awalau Street Estimated Start Date: Mid-March 2016 Estimated Duration: 1 Week



- Lanes will be reduced to one lane on each side of Farrington Highway from 8:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. the next day.
- No left turn 24/7 and no crossing Farrington Highway from 8:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. the next day.
- Honolulu Police Department special duty officers and/or flaggers will be on site to assist.

FARRINGTON HIGHWAY GUIDEWAY CONSTRUCTION & TRAFFIC ADVISORY FOR EQUIPMENT REMOVAL OPERATIONS

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- Traffic will be contraflowed onto one side of Farrington Highway.
- Reduced lanes and left turn restrictions will be in place at the Mokuola Street intersection.
- Honolulu Police Department special duty officers and/or flaggers will be on site to assist.

TRAFFIC ADVISORY:

- We ask that drivers, bicyclists and pedestrians be alert and remain undistracted as they move through the construction area.
- Observe posted speed limits and follow traffic signage or HPD/flagger instructions.
- Allow for extra time through the construction zone.



TRAFFIC PLANS FOR GUIDEWAY EQUIPMENT REMOVAL

Farrington Highway between Mokuola Street and Awamoku Street Estimated Start Date: February 29, 2016 Estimated Duration: 7-8 Weeks

WHEN EASTBOUND LANES ARE CLOSED (Red area below) EAST (town) bound traffic will be re-directed to contraflow to the mauka side of Farrington Highway

WHEN WESTBOUND LANES ARE CLOSED (Red area below) WEST (ewa) bound traffic will be re-directed to contraflow to the makai side of Farrington Highway OR may use Moloalo Street as an alternate business access road



LANE CLOSURES AND CONTRAFLOW:

- Monday through Friday (and Saturday as needed) from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 a.m. the next day.
- Crews will occupy either the eastbound or westbound lanes between Mokuola Street and Awamoku Street.
- Traffic will be detoured to the opposite side of Farrington Highway, with at least one lane open in each direction.
- Two eastbound lanes will remain open from 5:30 a.m. to 8:30 a.m.

LEFT TURN RESTRICTIONS:

- No left turn from Farrington Highway onto Mokuola Street or Awamoku Street. Follow detour signs to make a U-turn at Paiwa Street or Waipahu Depot Street.
- No left turn from Awalau Street onto Farrington Highway and no crossing through the intersection.
- No left turn from Mokuola Street onto Farrington Highway and no crossing through the intersection.
- All right turns are open.

BUSINESS/RESIDENTIAL ACCESS:

- Moloalo Street may be used for westbound access to mauka businesses/residences.
- No parking signs will be posted on Moloalo Street 24/7.
- Westbound left turn into 7-Eleven and Tanioka's business complex to remain open as possible.
- Awalau Street may be used for eastbound access to Makai businesses/residences.
