Bill Signing to improve Kupuna Care, Disability Access and Language Access



Act 247 (HB933) I am proud to be the primary introducer of this measure. Appropriates funds to the Public Utilities Commission to provide free telecommunications access to certain information for individuals with a print disability.

Act 257 (HB278) Appropriates funds for the executive office on aging to create and implement an Alzheimer's disease and related dementias public health campaign.

Act 251 (HB1081) Clarifies the penalty to be assessed on a person who intentionally operates a care facility without a certificate or license.

Act 256 (HB218) Requires certain pharmacies to provide accessible prescription drug label information to individuals who have difficulty seeing or reading.
