# NEW AND IMPROVED OUTDOOR SHOWERS



Kaimana beach is the first to showcase the new an improved outdoor beach showers. The new showers are low-flow shower which means the water pressure is much lighter. It is also timed, powering off after 45 seconds. It has several shower heads with one-foot wash station, located on a concrete pad.

Along with water conservation, the showers are in compliance with the city's storm water run-off permitting requirements, with a drain that the water flows into from the outdoor shower instead of the ocean


#### HAWAII MULTICULTURAL FESTIVAL


