Creative Media Center at UH West Oahu

Big changes are on the horizon for the creative media industry in Hawaii and for the ever-expanding UH West Oahu skyline. A contract for just over \$33 million dollars has been awarded to Kiewit Building Group to begin construction of the new Academy for Creative Media Center on the Kapolei campus. I worked closely with the University and guided the funding request and allocation through the legislative process to provide the best opportunities available to creative media students at UHWO.



The building will be the central focal point for the growing campus. It will include a two-story sound stage for filming, a 100-seat screening auditorium, smaller sound stages, editing and sound mixing suites and a shop for building film sets. Also, an outdoor screening area will allow hundreds of students to enjoy special screenings and presentations in the evenings.

Design work for the new facility is expected to be completed by the end of the year, with anticipated occupancy for classes and studios in the fall semester of 2020. Already in the works is a public/private partnership to build a major film studio and sound-stage for commercial TV and feature film production to be located adjacent to the West Oahu campus – creating an ideal opportunity for students to pursue careers in TV and film production.

Make your voice heard!

It's an election year in Hawaii, with primary voting scheduled for Saturday, August 11, and the general election on Tuesday, November 6.

The Legislature has moved to improve voter turnout by authorizing online voter registration, voting by mail or at walk-in polling locations ahead of election day, and – for the first time this year – enabling all qualified voters to register at polling places same-day on election day.

Even with same-day voter registration, the Office of Elections is encouraging people to register by July 12 for the August primary and October 9 for the November general election. Doing so minimizes last-minute rush business and assures that you are on the registered voter lists posted at polling places.
