Students and teachers at campuses on the traditional school calendar are back in their classrooms this week after the October fall break. A few weeks ago, the Department of Education released public school enrollment figures for the school year, and we learned that Mililani High School has the secondlargest student population among all high schools in the state with 2,571 students grades 9-12 on campus. And Mililani Middle School has the largest number of students on




campus among intermediate and middle schools statewide with 1,873 youngsters enrolled.


