Aloha Friends and Neighbors.

As you may know from media reports this week, the Department of Education may not be able to move as quickly as anticipated on the massive program to provide air conditioning for the state's hottest classrooms. The Board of Education heard an update on the Cooling Our Classrooms program – funded by a \$100 million legislative appropriation – at its meetings this week. DOE Superintendent Kathryn Matayoshi met with me last week to discuss re-opening bids, noting that while the costs of air conditioning equipment and fixtures are about what was anticipated, the State's construction industry boom has led to shortages of available qualified contractors and much higher labor costs than expected. She expressed the DOE's disappointment with these developments, and said that while re-bidding gets underway, there will be delays in reaching the goal of cooling 1,000 classrooms by the end of the year. I note my disappointment as well. We will be closely monitoring DOE's progress in making good on the promises made to our students.

By the way, I was informed this week that work will be underway soon on improvements to the air conditioning systems in Buildings B and D at **Mililani Waena Elementary**. A contract was awarded to Molina Engineering, Ltd., in the amount of \$187,522 for this work.

Funds have now been released for a major project in Central Oahu that my colleague Senator Donovan Dela Cruz and I worked hard to secure in the 2014 legislative session. The \$11.5 million appropriation will go for the purchase of about 150 acres of land for construction of a First Responders Technology Campus and Cyber Security Command Center at Milliani Tech Park. The facilities would provide a centralized and consolidated home for Oahu first responders, including training facilities and warehouse space. Potential tenants include HPD, HFD, State Sheriffs, Hawaii Emergency Management Agency (formerly State Civil Defense), Hawaii National Guard and the State's data center.

I'm also pleased to announce that a contract has been awarded to Close Construction, Inc., for \$387,273 for several pending repair and maintenance projects at **Mililani Uka Elementary**. School administration and the contractor will be working on a schedule for work that will ensure the campus is safe and secure.

Next month, Waipahu area residents will have an opportunity to learn more about ongoing rail construction along Farrington Highway. Hawaiian Dredging and Construction Company has been awarded the contract to build three transit stops—West Loch Station, Waipahu Transit Center and Leeward Community College Station. The ongoing series of business and community meetings will be held on the second Thursday of each month going forward. The next session will be on Thursday, July 14, at Waipahu Intermediate School beginning at 6:30 pm.
