Senate Ways and Means Committee Visit Pāhoa Elementary on Hawai'i Island





As a member of the Senate Ways and Means (WAM) Committee and Chair of the Senate Committee on Education, I had the opportunity to participate in a series of site visits on Hawai'i Island. These visits allow us to learn from State officials about key issues and priorities.

One of the highlights of our visit was a stop at Pāhoa Elementary, where we received updates on important initiatives, including the Early Childhood Educator Stipend Program. Earlier this year, the Legislature committed \$660,000 to the initiative which aims to boost the State's early childhood workforce. This initiative is the first publicly funded tuition stipend program available to current and future practitioners in the field for both Hawaiian and English mediums. I firmly believe our early childhood workforce, especially those in the classroom working directly with children, are the backbone of a quality program. I am grateful to Lieutenant Governor Sylvia Luke for leading these efforts through the Ready Keiki Initiative. With continued partnership between the Legislature and State departments, we can continue to provide opportunities for our keiki and early childhood educators.

Koa Vista Groundbreaking

I had the opportunity to attend a groundbreaking ceremony for Koa Vista I, an affordable rental project for qualifying seniors and families. The development, located off Ka Uka Boulevard across from Waipi'o Costco, will feature 192 units to provide quality housing options for seniors with incomes between 30 and 60 percent of the area median income. Koa Vista I is set to open its doors by late 2024 and is funded through the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation and supported by tax credits and revenue bonds.
