SB 693 RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDU, WAM Appropriates funds to expand transition programs for militaryimpacted schools in the State and to hire necessary personnel to coordinate the transition programs. **SB 7** RELATING TO THE JUNIOR RESERVE OFFICERS' TRAINING EDU, WAM CORPS. Appropriates funds to create two instructor positions for the Air Force JROTC program at Lahainaluna High School. SB 690 RELATING TO SCHOOL CLOSURES OR CONSOLIDATIONS. EDU, WAM Requires the department of education to conduct a cost benefit analysis and determine the cost savings of school closures or consolidations. Requires fifty per cent of the actual fiscal savings to be retained by the new configuration of affected schools for a period of not less than five years. SB 867 RELATING TO EDUCATION. **EDU** Directs the department of education to conduct a study of converting hard cover textbooks to e-books. Report to 2008 legislature. SB 1131 RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDU, WAM Appropriates moneys to the office of information technology services for the continued implementation of student information systems, student support systems, additional program requirements, and infrastructure enhancements for fiscal years 2008 and 2009. SB 1137 RELATING TO AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAMS. EDU, WAM Establishes an after-school activities program coordinator position and

a task force to review and recommend improvements to the State's after-school, weekend, and semester break programs. Appropriates

funds.

SB 95 RELATING TO VACANT POSITIONS IN THE DEPARTMENT OF EDU

EDUCATION.

Repeals provisions relating to vacant positions that are no longer

needed due to Act 51, Session Laws of Hawaii 2004.

SB 688 RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDU, WAM

Appropriates \$50,000, in each year of the fiscal biennium to the P-20 Initiative for the initiation and development of plans for education in

Hawaii in the new century.

SB 1128 RELATING TO UNIFORM QUARTERLY ASSESSMENT. EDU, WAM

Appropriates funding for the department of education to develop or purchase quarterly assessment instruments that will provide all schools with accurate and common measurements of achievement and progress

on the Hawaii state assessment tests.

SB 1095 RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDU, WAM

Establishes quality assurance committees at various levels of the department of education to address policies impacting the delivery of services by state child serving agencies and provide opportunities for community input and feedback. Includes representatives from other state agencies and private organizations. Appropriates funds for

staffing.

SB 1143 RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDU, WAM

Appropriates moneys to the department of education for reduction in kindergarten class size and to establish new teacher advisors/peer assistance mentors. Requires collaboration between the principal, faculty, and the school community council in the development of the

school academic and financial plan.

SB 1151 RELATING TO EDUCATION. EDU, WAM

Ensures quality instruction and positive teacher-student interaction in public schools by allowing a reasonable reduction in school enrollment

before reallocating staffing positions.

Decision Making to follow, if time permits.
