- (1) Organized by group/category of program/project for which ARRA funds have been obtained, please provide the following information:
- (a) A brief summary project description;

The State of Hawaii, Department of Transportation (HDOT), Highways Division, received \$125,746,382 in ARRA funds. The selection of projects to be undertaken with ARRA funds was a result of a collaborative effort between the four counties and the State DOT to ensure an equitable distribution of ARRA funds. After a list of prospective county and state projects was compiled by DOT and the respective county agencies, we met with the Mayors of each county to discuss and identify projects statewide.

The final selection of projects was based on the following criteria:

Projects:

- 1. That would meet the ARRA timelines;
- 2. In economically distressed areas (Hawaii and Molokai);
- 3. That would employ a diversity of trades;
- 4. That would provide secondary benefits in promoting future job growth such as low cost housing;
- 5. That would provide general transportation benefits to road and highway users.

We also took into account the selection of projects that would employ people over a longer period of time (2-3 years) versus the approach taken by other jurisdictions that selected projects that were easy and quick to get out but would employ people over a shorter period of time (2-3 months). How Hawaii is investing taxpayer monies is important. We felt it important to make sure the investment of these funds would go towards extended employment and longer term benefits.

We are aware that approximately 49 percent of ARRA funds spent for highway systems on a national level have or will be used on resurfacing projects. It is important to note that in comparison, only 14 percent of the ARRA funds apportioned to Hawaii is being used on resurfacing projects.

The Airports Division received 3 ARRA grants:

- The structural improvements project for the apron pavement at Kahului Airport is 100% complete. The grant amount is \$15 million.
- The EDS integration improvements project at Kahului Airport is 100% complete. The grant amount is approximately \$7.2 million.
- Phase II of the EDS integration improvements project at Honolulu International Airport is underway. The grant amount is approximately \$24.6 million.

The Harbors Division received 2 ARRA grants:

- Construction of Pier 29 Container Yard at Honolulu Harbor is less than 1% complete. It involves the construction of approximately 9 acres of concrete pavement, 1 acre of A.C. pavement and 2 acres of gravel fill area. It also includes upgrading all affected utilities and disposal of contaminated material. The grant amount is \$24.5 million.
- The purchase of equipment to enhance our port's infrastructure to prevent, protect, respond and recover from threats of terrorism is 0% complete. The grant amount is approximately \$1.4 million.

HDOT received 6 ARRA grants for Federal Transit Administration (FTA) projects. Funds total \$2,933,435. All monies were equally distributed to each of the following nonurban counties: Hawaii, Kauai & Maui. Each of the counties used their funds to purchase buses, with Hawaii County adding bus shelters to their purchase.

No funds have been returned to the federal government. Funds for highway project S6 – Kuhio Highway have been deobligated and used for SBU5 Kaumualii Highway Improvement Project.

To meet the rigorous deadlines and stricter requirements imposed by the ACT, we did see the kind of resiliency and hard working individuals that we all possess within our agencies. We developed new strategies and innovative approaches to deliver projects faster in light of some of the resource challenges we face during our recession.

However, with the addition of these unanticipated funds to further accelerate infrastructure initiatives, the challenges to deliver and perform were sometimes overwhelming and often made for difficult choices in resource allocation on new initiatives versus existing responsibilities. The reality is the agencies dedicate a significant amount of resources to manage, monitor, and fulfill the new federal requirements that come with acceptance of these additional federal funds.

Greater flexibility in working through federal regulations would assist agencies in delivering projects more quickly. Strict compliance with all pre-existing requirements, though not necessarily critical to the delivery of a project but more applicable to the "process" by which they are delivered, such as the TIP and STIP processes, seemed to be contrary to the intent of the ACT to create and stimulate the economy in the quickest fashion possible.

We also understand the desire for the amount of reporting and oversight control by our federal agency partners. However, the degree to which the reporting and oversight is required take away from the same resources necessary to deliver the projects themselves. This has a tremendous impact on Hawaii's agencies as our good intentions to spread the work around to benefit the largest amount of stakeholders also resulted in a greater amount of paperwork. Reporting on three very large projects would have been far easier for agencies as compared to tracking and reporting on two dozen smaller projects. Therefore, the incentive to distribute the ARRA funds more equitably did not exist and states that did distribute funds to a wider base were, in essence, penalized for doing so.

We are appreciative of the ARRA funds we have received to date. These critical funds have helped us deliver much needed projects to Hawaii communities, thereby stimulating local economies. We look forward to working with our federal resource partners, especially FHWA, FAA and MARAD, in a collaborative manner as we bring the ARRA projects through construction to project dedication.
