SUBJECT: H.B. No. 2598, H.D. 1 Relating to Abandoned and Derelict Vehicles

The City and County of Honolulu, Department of Customer Services (CSD) **supports the intent of H.B. No. 2598, H.D. 1** establishing a task force to make recommendations for appropriate identification and disposal of abandoned and derelict vehicles.

Towing abandoned and derelict vehicles falls under the scope of CSD when vehicles are on City and County of Honolulu's roadways. This measure seeks to address abandoned and derelict vehicles left on State highways. This effort is a right step toward addressing this statewide concern. Based on the Honolulu's experience, identifying an abandoned or derelict vehicle is not the issue. Rather, CSD offers two areas to consider which will facilitate a faster removal of these vehicles from the roadways.

- 2. An efficient and reliable process ensuring appropriate disposal of the abandoned or derelict vehicle, which includes removing or shipping the metal away from Hawaii.
