Dear Chair Nishihara, Vice-Chair Wakai, and Committee members:

The First Amendment to the Constitution of the United States provides for freedom of religion, speech, and press; and the right to peaceably assemble and to petition the government. Yet, as fundamental and sacrosanct as those values are to America, few if any would argue that those freedoms are not subject to reasonable restrictions (take the cliché of "yelling 'Fire' in a crowded theater").

Similarly, the Second Amendment guarantees the right to keep and bear arms. This right, too, must be subject to reasonable restrictions, or else we would each be able to have our own machine gun mounted on our mantelpiece or strapped over our shoulders.

So the question comes down to what is reasonable. That should be determined by a free people acting through their elected representatives, in this case our State Legislature. And given the times in which we live, and the carnage that we have witnessed both in our own state and across the country, I thank you for taking on the divisive but crucial task of deciding what reasonable restrictions might be.

You have seven bills on today's agenda that would impinge on the right to keep and bear arms: SB 2002 would prohibit possession of a loaded firearm while intoxicated. One would hope that this is not a difficult issue on which to find common ground, though I expect some will disagree.

SB 2518 implies that its adoption would make Hawaii's license-to-carry-firearms law stronger against attack in court. If this Committee finds that to be true, I support it. I have not been able to independently verify that assertion, and hope you will hear from the administration and other law enforcement.

SB 2519 would prohibit large capacity magazines for all firearms. Such magazines are already restricted for pistols, and SB2519 might be the most important bill before you today, given the data on mass shootings that is set forth in the preamble of this bill.

SB 2635 would regulate ammunition the same way firearms are regulated, and require the licensing of sellers of ammunition. It would seem that this proposal would be particularly valuable in the case of a firearm that is lost or stolen, but also in tracing ammunition that is used in a crime.

SB 2943 would prohibit the assembly of a gun that would not have a serial number (a "ghost gun") and would mandate a serial number for firearms brought into Hawaii that do not already have one.

SB 3053 would prohibit 50-caliber guns. I have seen these guns on YouTube and they are awesomelooking weapons. I cannot imagine a legitimate civilian use for them.

SB 3054 would require notification when a firearm is moved out-of-state. This would be of some value, though perhaps limited. On the other hand, the burden on a gun owner seems minimal.

Can any of the restrictions contained in the seven bills be considered unreasonable? I have no doubt that some will say yes, but except for my questions about SB 2518, I would argue that all of these bills would make Hawaii a safer place without unduly restricting the right to keep and bear arms.

There also is an eighth bill on the agenda, SB 2437, relating to electric guns. I confess total ignorance on that subject, and therefore do not offer testimony on it.

Again, thank you for taking on these issues.

Dear Chairman Nishihara:

On behalf of the members of the National Rifle Association in Hawaii, I would like to communicate our strong opposition to Senate Bill 2519 (SB 2159).

SB 2519 prohibits possession of magazines capable of holding more than ten rounds. Gun control advocates like to label these magazines as "large" or "high capacity". However, they are in fact standard equipment for commonly-owned firearms that many Americans legally and effectively use for an entire range of legitimate purposes, such as self-defense or competition.

Evidence clearly shows that magazine bans do absolutely nothing to combat crime, and actually make communities less safe. The Federal "assault weapon ban" of 1994-2004 contained a similar provision banning "large" magazines. The congressionally-mandated study of the ban by the Urban Institute found that the ban had no impact on crime. In fact, murder rates were 19.3% higher when the ban was in effect.

Proponents will also argue that limiting the capacity of magazines will make shootings less deadly, but evidence does not support this conclusion either. The aforementioned study found that the Federal ban's 10-round limit on new magazines was not a factor in multiple-victim or multiple-wound crimes. Subsequent research conducted by the RAND Corporation found no conclusive evidence that banning "large" capacity magazines has an effect on mass shootings. Another follow-up study published in the official journal of the Society for Advancement of Violence and Injury Research found that "gunshot injury incidents involving pistols [many of which use magazines that hold more than 10 rounds] were less likely to produce a death than those involving revolvers [which typically hold 5-6 rounds]" and "the average number of wounds for pistol victims was actually lower than that for revolver victims".

Furthermore, SB 2519 would constitute a clear violation of the Hawaiian citizenry's Second Amendment rights. Law abiding citizens have the right to defend themselves and their loved ones using whatever equipment they find most effective. Magazines with a capacity higher than 10 or 15 rounds are in common use and have a clear self-defense purpose, and should therefore certainly be covered under the standard defined by the Supreme Court in *District of Colombia vs. Heller*.

SB 2159 provides no public safety benefit, and will do nothing more than strip law-abiding citizens of their ability to use effective equipment in self-defense. It will render Hawaiians both less free, and less safe.

Aloha Members of the Senate Committee,

The Hawaii Firearms Coalition OPPOSES SB2519.

The Hawaii Firearms Coalition opposes this bill due to prohibiting rifle magazines able to hold more than 10 rounds. Currently, rifle magazines that hold 20-30 rounds are legal here in Hawaii and number in the HUNDREDS of THOUSANDS. This law would turn the owners of the magazines into felons overnight.

The bill makes mention of the use of large capacity magazines in "every mass shooting" of the last decade. This is not the case. The shooter in the tragic shooting at Parkland used 10 round magazines exclusively. The shooter in the 2007 Virginia Tech shooting also used 10 round magazines. The bill falsely makes the claim that large capacity magazines led to the higher fatality rates. The truth rather is much simpler, 98% of all mass shootings have occurred in "gun free zones". The higher fatalities occurred because the shooter knew that the people in these schools, churches, and concerts were all disarmed and could not shoot back. Thus the idea that this ban would reduce gun violence in any shape or form is deeply flawed and a flat out lie.

HIFICO opposes this bill:

- There is currently a lawsuit in the 9th circuit challenging a similar law banning large capacity magazines. SB2519 should be deferred if not removed from consideration until this case is resolved as the 9th Circuit had issued a preliminary injunction stopping California's magazine ban. - 2. The cost of compensation for the 100s of thousands of these magazines in this state will be in the **millions of dollars** in cost to the state and taxpayers.
- 3. The magazine is an integral part of the firearm.
- 4. Many home invasions involve multiple attackers. Reducing the capacity of a magazine for rifles would hurt the ability of women, elderly, and disabled firearms owners to defend themselves by requiring them to reload in the middle of the effort to defend themselves.

Please vote no on this deeply flawed proposed legislation.

For these reasons the Hawaii Firearms Coalition Opposes SB2519. Thank you for your consideration.

Ninth Circuit Upholds Block of California Gun Magazine Ban

SAN FRANCISCO (CN) – A Ninth Circuit panel on Tuesday affirmed a federal judge's order preliminarily barring California from enforcing a voter-approved ban on high-capacity gun magazines.

In *Duncan v. Becerra*, U.S. District Judge Roger Benitez temporarily blocked a portion of Proposition 63 that

prohibits possession of magazines holding more than 10 rounds of ammunition. The issue is set to go to trial this fall.

California Attorney General Xavier Becerra appealed to the Ninth Circuit, arguing Benitez abused his discretion in granting the injunction in favor of Virginia Duncan and the California Rifle & Pistol Association.

But in an 8-page unpublished memorandum issued Tuesday, U.S. Circuit Judge Norman Smith and U.S. District Judge Deborah Batts of the Southern District of New York ruled Benitez used the correct level of scrutiny to decide the preliminary injunction.

"The district court did not abuse its discretion by concluding that magazines for a weapon likely fall within the scope of the Second Amendment," the judges said, adding that Becerra hadn't pointed to any errors made by Benitez.

"[Becerra's argument] is insufficient to establish that the district court's findings of fact and its application of the legal standard to those facts were "illogical, implausible, or without support in inferences that may be drawn from facts in the record," the majority held. In his June 2017 order, Benitez said gun owners' "entitlement to enjoy Second Amendment rights and just compensation is not eliminated simply because they possess 'unpopular' magazines holding more than 10 rounds."

In his dissent, U.S. Circuit Judge John Wallace said a "reasonable fit" between gun owners' rights and Proposition 63 can be accommodated if the state can show it does not challenge or burden core elements of the Second Amendment.

Wallace disagreed with his colleagues' "judgment calls" on evidence submitted by the state in the case.

"California's evidence – which included statistical studies, expert testimony, and surveys of mass shootings showing that the use of large-capacity magazines increases the lethality of gun violence – was more than sufficient to satisfy intermediate scrutiny," Wallace wrote.

Wallace said the September 2013 Mayors Against Illegal Guns Survey, which Benitez wrote off as "inconclusive and irrelevant," satisfied the requirement for relevant evidence.

The survey shows that assault weapons or large-capacity magazines were used in at least 15 percent of the mass shootings reported, and that in those incidents 151 percent more people were shot – and 63 percent more people died – than in other mass shootings the researchers looked at.

Wallace said he would have reversed Benitez's injunction, though he did credit the judge for "ensuring the case did not stall awaiting disposition of this appeal."

Plaintiff attorney Chuck Michel with Michel Associates said his clients are "thrilled" with the court's ruling. He said gun owners hope they won't be "turned into criminals" by state laws that ban what they've possessed legally for years.

"These standard capacity magazines are overwhelmingly chosen by lawabiding citizens for sport or to protect their families," Michel said.

In a statement, the California Rifle & Pistol Association – which joined as a plaintiff in the case – called the ruling a blow to Lt. Gov. Gavin Newsom's "anti-gun agenda." Newsom is also the front-runner to be California's next governor.

The gun-rights advocacy group questioned the merits of Becerra's appeal, pointing to a motion for summary judgment which Benitez has yet to decide. A ruling on the merits of the case is also expected later this year.

"Regardless of the outcome, the case will most certainly be appealed again to the Ninth Circuit," the group said. "But by that time, the Supreme Court will likely have a new justice who respects the right to keep and bear arms as protected by the Second Amendment."

In an emailed statement to Courthouse News, the California Department of Justice it is reviewing the court's opinion and "will continue to vigorously defend the challenged law."

Magazines holding more than 10 rounds have been banned in California since 2000, but a previously intact grandfather clause allowed lawful owners who purchased high-capacity magazines before the law to keep them. Proposition 63, passed by 63 percent of voters in 2016, eliminated the grandfather clause.

A section of Proposition 63 required owners of guns with high-capacity magazines to surrender lawfully purchased property or face criminal prosecution. The ban was to take effect on July 1, 2017.

No government buyback was included in the law. The plaintiffs say some gun owners could lose thousands of dollars in magazines – amounting to an unlawful taking, they say.

The State of California ("California"), through its Attorney General, Xavier

Becerra, appeals the district court's grant of a preliminary injunction enjoining

California from enforcing California Penal Code §§ 32310(c) & (d). "We review a district court's decision to grant or deny a preliminary injunction for abuse of discretion." *Thalheimer v. City of San Diego*, 645 F.3d 1109, 1115 (9th Cir. 2011). We do not "determine the ultimate merits," but rather "determine only whether the district court correctly distilled the applicable rules of law and exercised permissible discretion in applying those rules to the facts at hand." *Fyock v. Sunnyvale*, 779 F.3d 991, 995 (9th Cir. 2015). We have jurisdiction under 28 U.S.C. § 1292(a)(1), and we affirm.¹

I.

The district court did not abuse its discretion by granting a preliminary injunction on Second Amendment grounds. *Thalheimer*, 645 F.3d 1109 at 1115.

¹ "A plaintiff seeking a preliminary injunction must establish that he is likely to succeed on the merits, that he is likely to suffer irreparable harm in the absence of preliminary relief, that the balance of equities tips in his favor, and that an injunction is in the public interest." *Winter v. Nat. Res. Def. Council, Inc.*, 555 U.S. 7, 20 (2008). California makes only a cursory argument that the latter three elements are unmet if we find the district court did not abuse its discretion regarding the first element. Because we find the district court did not abuse its discretion, we only address the first element of the preliminary injunction standard for each constitutional question. *Greenwood v. FAA*, 28 F.3d 971, 977 (9th Cir. 1994) ("We review only issues which are argued specifically and distinctly in a party's opening brief. . . . [A] bare assertion does not preserve a claim, particularly when, as here, a host of other issues are presented for review." (citation omitted)).

1. The district court did not abuse its discretion by concluding that magazines for a weapon likely fall within the scope of the Second Amendment. First, the district court identified the applicable law, citing *United States v. Miller*, 307 U.S. 174 (1939), District of Columbia v. Heller, 554 U.S. 570 (2008), Caetano v. Massachusetts, 136 S. Ct. 1027 (2016) (per curiam), and Jackson v. City and County of San Francisco, 746 F.3d 953 (9th Cir. 2014). Second, it did not exceed its permissible discretion by concluding, based on those cases, that (1) some part of the Second Amendment right likely includes the right to bear a weapon "that has some reasonable relationship to the preservation or efficiency of a well regulated militia," Miller, 307 U.S. at 178; see also Heller, 554 U.S. at 583, 627-28; Caetano, 136 S. Ct. at 1028; and (2) the ammunition for a weapon is similar to the magazine for a weapon, Jackson 746 F.3d at 967 ("[T]he right to possess firearms for protection implies a corresponding right' to obtain the bullets necessary to use them." (quoting *Ezell v. City of Chicago*, 61 F.3d 684, 704 (7th Cir. 2011))).

2. The district court did not abuse its discretion by applying the incorrect level of scrutiny. The district court applied both intermediate scrutiny and what it coined the "simple test" of *Heller*. The district court found Plaintiffs were likely to succeed under either analysis. Although the district court applied two different tests, there is no reversible error if one of those tests follows the applicable legal

principles and the district court ultimately reaches the same conclusion in both analyses.

Here, in its intermediate scrutiny analysis, the district court correctly applied the two-part test outlined in *Jackson*. The district court concluded that a ban on ammunition magazines is not a presumptively lawful regulation and that the prohibition did not have a "historical pedigree." Next, the district court concluded, citing *Fyock*, that section 32310 infringed on the core of the Second Amendment right, but, citing *Silvester v. Harris*, 843 F.3d 816, 823 (9th Cir. 2016), *Fyock*, 779 F.3d at 999, *Jackson*, 746 F.3d at 965, 968, and *Chovan*, 735 F.3d at 1138, that intermediate scrutiny was the appropriate scrutiny level. The district court concluded that California had identified four "important" interests and reasoned that the proper question was "whether the dispossession and criminalization components of [section] 32310's ban on firearm magazines holding any more than 10 rounds is a reasonable fit for achieving these important goals."

3. The district court did not abuse its discretion by concluding that sections 32310(c) and (d) did not survive intermediate scrutiny. The district court's review of the evidence included numerous judgment calls regarding the quality, type, and reliability of the evidence, as well as repeated credibility determinations. Ultimately, the district court concluded that section 32310 is "not likely to be a

reasonable fit." California articulates no actual error made by the district court, but, rather, multiple instances where it disagrees with the district court's conclusion or analysis regarding certain pieces of evidence. This is insufficient to establish that the district court's findings of fact and its application of the legal standard to those facts were "illogical, implausible, or without support in inferences that may be drawn from facts in the record." *United States v. Hinkson*, 585 F.3d 1247, 1251 (9th Cir. 2009) (en banc). In reviewing the district court's grant of a preliminary injunction, we cannot "re-weigh the evidence and overturn the district court's

evidentiary determinations—in effect, to substitute our discretion for that of the district court." *Fyock*, 779 F.3d at 1000.²

II.

The district court did not abuse its discretion by granting a preliminary injunction on Takings Clause grounds. *Thalheimer*, 645 F.3d at 1115. First, the district court, citing *Lingle v. Chevron U.S.A. Inc.*, 544 U.S. 528 (2005), *Horne v. Department of Agriculture*, 135 S. Ct. 2419 (2015), *Loretta v. Teleprompter Manhattan CATV Corp.*, 458 U.S. 419 (1982), *Murr v. Wisconsin*, 137 S. Ct. 1933 (2017), and *Lucas v. South Carolina Coastal Council*, 505 U.S. 1003 (1992),

Further, disagreeing with another district court regarding a similar record is not necessarily an abuse of discretion. Here, the district court made evidentiary conclusions regarding the record provided by California, specifically noting that it had provided "incomplete studies from unreliable sources upon which experts base speculative explanation and predictions." These conclusions are not "illogical, implausible, or without support in inferences that may be drawn from facts in the record." *Hinkson*, 585 F.3d at 1251. As noted above, it is not our role to "re-weigh the evidence and overturn the district court's evidentiary determinations—in effect, to substitute our discretion for that of the district court." *Fyock*, 779 F.3d at 1000.

² The dissent *does* re-weigh the evidence. It concludes that "California's evidence . . . was more than sufficient to satisfy intermediate scrutiny" and that the "2013 Mayors Against Illegal Guns (MAIG) Survey . . . easily satisfies the requirement that the evidence upon which the state relies be 'reasonably believed to be relevant' and 'fairly support' the rationale for the challenged law." These conclusions mean the dissent *is* "substitut[ing] [its] discretion for that of the district court," which is impermissible under the applicable standard of review. *Fyock*, 779 F.3d at 1000-01.

outlined the correct legal principles. Second, the district court did not exceed its discretion by concluding (1) that the three options provided in section 32310(d) (surrender, removal, or sale) fundamentally "deprive Plaintiffs not just of the *use* of their property, but of *possession*, one of the most essential sticks in the bundle of property rights"; and (2) that California could not use the police power to avoid compensation, *Lucas*, 505 U.S. at 1020-29; *Loretto*, 458 U.S. at 426 (holding "a permanent physical occupation authorized by the government is a taking without regard to the public interest it may serve").³

³ The dissent also "re-weigh[s] the evidence" and the district court's conclusions on the Takings Clause question. Fyock, 779 F.3d at 1000. The district court concluded that the three options available under section 32310(d) constituted either a physical taking (surrender to the government for destruction) or a regulatory taking (forced sale to a firearms dealer or removal out of state). The dissent first takes issue with the district court's conclusion that storage out of state could be financially prohibitive. It is not "illogical" or "implausible" to conclude that forcing citizens to remove property out of state effectively dispossess the property due to the financial burden of using it again. Hinkson, 585 F.3d at 1263. Such removal, as the district court notes, also eliminates use of the Banned Magazines in "self defense." See Heller, 554 U.S. at 592 ("[W]e find that [the text of the Second Amendment] guarantee[s] the individual [a] right to possess and carry weapons in case of confrontation."). Second, the dissent argues the district court incorrectly weighed the regulatory takings factors in Murr. While the cost (\$20 to \$50) of the magazine may seem minimal, the district court also noted that the "character of the governmental action," Murr, 137 S. Ct. at 1943, was such that "California will deprive Plaintiffs not just of the use of their property, but of possession," Similarly, this conclusion is not "illogical," "implausible," or "without support in inferences that may be drawn from the facts in the record." Hinkson, 585 F.3d at 1263.

I respectfully dissent. For the reasons stated below, I conclude that the district court abused its discretion in preliminarily enjoining California Penal Code §§ 32310(c) & (d).

I.

In this case, we apply intermediate scrutiny because the challenged law "does not implicate a core Second Amendment right, or ... place a substantial burden on the Second Amendment right." Jackson v. City and Cty. of San Francisco, 746 F.3d 953, 961 (9th Cir. 2014). Under this standard, a challenged law will survive constitutional scrutiny so long as the state establishes a "reasonable fit" between the law and an important government interest. United States v. Chovan, 735 F.3d 1127, 1136 (9th Cir. 2013). "When reviewing the reasonable fit between the government's stated objective and the regulation at issue, the court may consider 'the legislative history of the enactment as well as studies in the record or cited in pertinent case law." Fyock v. Sunnyvale, 779 F.3d 991, 1000 (9th Cir. 2015) (quoting *Jackson*, 746 F.3d at 966). California may establish a reasonable fit with "any evidence 'reasonably believed to be relevant' to substantiate its important interests." Id.

The majority concludes the district court did not abuse its discretion in concluding California's large-capacity magazine (LCM) possession ban did not survive intermediate scrutiny on the ground that the district court's conclusion was based on "numerous judgment calls regarding the quality, type, and reliability of the evidence." The problem, however, is that the district court's "judgment calls" presupposed a much too high evidentiary burden for the state. Under intermediate scrutiny, the question is not whether the state's evidence satisfies the district court's subjective standard of empiricism, but rather whether the state relies on evidence "reasonably believed to be relevant" to substantiate its important interests. Fyock, 779 F.3d at 1000. So long as the state's evidence "fairly supports" its conclusion that a ban on possession of LCMs would reduce the lethality of gun violence and promote public safety, the ban survives intermediate scrutiny. Jackson, 746 F.3d at 969.

California's evidence—which included statistical studies, expert testimony, and surveys of mass shootings showing that the use of LCMs increases the lethality of gun violence—was more than sufficient to satisfy intermediate scrutiny. For example, the September 2013 Mayors Against Illegal Guns (MAIG) Survey, which the district court writes off as inconclusive and irrelevant, easily satisfies the requirement that the evidence upon which the state relies be "reasonably believed to be relevant" and "fairly support" the rationale for the challenged law. The

MAIG survey shows that assault weapons or LCMs were used in at least 15 percent of the mass shootings reported, and that in those incidents 151 percent more people were shot, and 63 percent more people died, as compared to other mass shootings surveyed. Even if the MAIG survey also shows that most mass shooting incidents did not involve LCMs, California could draw a "reasonable inference" based on the data that prohibiting possession of LCMs would reduce the lethality of gun violence. Jackson, 746 F.3d at 966. Other evidence cited by the state similarly supports the conclusion that mass shootings involving LCMs result in a higher number of shots fired, a higher number of injuries, and a higher number of fatalities than other mass shootings. The district court's characterization of this evidence as insufficient was based either on clearly erroneous findings of fact or an application of intermediate scrutiny that lacked support in inferences that could be drawn from facts in the record. In either case, it was an abuse of discretion.

It is significant that California, in seeking to establish a reasonable fit between §§ 32310(c) & (d) and its interest in reducing the lethality of mass shootings, relied on much of the same evidence presented by the City of Sunnyvale in *Fyock*, a case in which we affirmed the district court's conclusion that Sunnyvale's LCM possession ban was likely to survive intermediate scrutiny. The district court attempts to distinguish the two cases, stressing that an "important difference" between this case and *Fyock* is that the court in *Fyock* "had a

sufficiently convincing evidentiary record of a reasonable fit," which "is not the case here." But the evidentiary record in *Fyock* included much of the same evidence the district court here found insufficient—including the aforementioned September 2013 MAIG survey, and expert declarations by Lucy Allen and John Donohue, which the district court dismissed as "defective" and "biased." The district court did not explain why the evidentiary record in *Fyock* was "sufficiently convincing," while a substantially similar evidentiary record here was insufficient. Given the overlap between the records, and the district court's failure to identify any material differences, the district court's contention that the record here is less credible, less reliable, and less relevant than the record in *Fyock* is difficult to accept.

The majority argues in a footnote that in concluding the district court abused its discretion I have impermissibly re-weighed the evidence. That is not so. Our obligation to refrain from re-weighing evidence is meant to ensure we do not overturn a district court's ruling simply because we would have placed more weight on certain pieces of evidence than others. This obligation to refrain presumes the district court has applied the correct legal standard. Here, by contrast, my argument is that the district court did not evaluate the evidence consistent with the applicable legal standard. This is conceptually distinct from the question whether one piece of evidence should have been given more weight vis-à-vis

another piece of evidence. Here, the district court was required under intermediate scrutiny to credit evidence "reasonably believed to be relevant" to advancing the state's important interests. *Fyock*, 779 F.3d at 1000. Instead, the district court rejected this standard for a subjective standard of undefined empirical robustness, which it found the state did not satisfy. This it cannot do.

In sum, I conclude the district court abused its discretion in concluding that California had not established a "reasonable fit" between §§ 32310(c) & (d) and the state's important interests. On the record before the district court, California's LCM possession ban likely survives intermediate scrutiny. Therefore, Plaintiffs were unlikely to succeed on the merits of their Second Amendment challenge and were not entitled to a preliminary injunction.

II.

The district court also concluded that Plaintiffs were likely to succeed on the merits of their claim under the Takings Clause on the ground that §§ 32310(c) & (d) was both a physical appropriation of property and a regulatory taking. In my view, the district court's application of relevant takings doctrine was without support in inferences that could be drawn from facts in the record, and therefore constituted an abuse of discretion.

The district court is correct that a physical appropriation of personal property gives rise to a *per se* taking. *Horne v. Department of Agriculture*, 135 S. Ct. 2419,

2427 (2015). But here, LCM owners can comply with § 32310 without the state physically appropriating their magazines. Under § 32310(d)(1), an LCM owner may "[r]emove the large-capacity magazine from the state," retaining ownership of the LCM, as well as rights to possess and use the magazines out of state. The district court hypothesized that LCM owners may find removal to be more costly than it is worth, but such speculation, while theoretically relevant to the regulatory takings inquiry, does not turn the compulsory removal of LCMs from the state into a "physical appropriation" by the state. See Tahoe-Sierra Pres. Council v. Tahoe Reg'l Planning Agency, 535 U.S. 302, 323 (2002) (explaining that it is "inappropriate to treat cases involving physical takings as controlling precedents for the evaluation of a claim that there has been a 'regulatory taking,' and vice versa") (footnote omitted). Given that Plaintiffs do not specify whether they intend to surrender or sell their LCMs, as opposed to remove them from the state and retain ownership, the availability of the removal option means Plaintiffs are unlikely to succeed on their claim that the LCM possession ban is unconstitutional as a physical taking. See Italian Colors Rest. v. Becerra, 878 F.3d 1165, 1175 (9th Cir. 2018) (explaining that to succeed on a facial challenge, plaintiffs must show either that "no set of circumstances exists under which the challenged law would be valid," or that the law lacks any "plainly legitimate sweep"); cf. Wash. State Grange v. Wash. State Republican Party, 552 U.S. 442, 450 (2008) ("In

determining whether a law is facially invalid, we must be careful not to go beyond the statute's facial requirements and speculate about 'hypothetical' or 'imaginary' cases.").

Nor was the district court within its discretion to conclude that § 32310 likely constituted a regulatory taking. Under the relevant *Penn Central* balancing test, a regulatory taking may be found based on "a complex of factors," including "(1) the economic impact of the regulation on the claimant; (2) the extent to which the regulation has interfered with distinct investment-backed expectations; and (3) the character of the government action." *Murr v. Wisconsin*, 137 S. Ct. 1933, 1943 (2017); *Penn Central Transp. Co. v. New York City*, 438 U.S. 104, 124 (1978).

Here, the district court speculated that because the typical retail cost of an LCM is "between \$20 and \$50," LCM owners may find "the associated costs of removal and storage and retrieval" to be too high to justify retaining their magazines. In my view, this speculation is insufficient to conclude that plaintiffs are likely to succeed on the merits of their regulatory takings claim. Even accepting the district court's finding on the "typical retail cost" of an LCM, there are no facts in the record from which to draw an inference regarding the overall economic impact of §§ 32310(c) & (d) on Plaintiffs, particularly as it relates to Plaintiffs' "distinct investmentbacked expectations" for their LCMs. Without this foundation, the district court could not plausibly draw the inference that requiring the removal of LCMs from California was "functionally equivalent" to a direct appropriation and thus constituted a regulatory taking. *Lingle v. Chevron USA Inc.*, 544 U.S. 528, 539 (2005).

III.

"Abuse-of-discretion review is highly deferential to the district court." Microsoft Corp. v. Motorola, Inc., 696 F.3d 872, 881 (9th Cir. 2012). In this case, however, I do not consider it a close call to conclude the district court abused its discretion in finding Plaintiffs were likely to succeed on the merits of their constitutional challenges to California's LCM ban. As to Plaintiffs' Second Amendment challenge, the district court clearly misapplied intermediate scrutiny by refusing to credit relevant evidence that fairly supports the state's rationale for its LCM ban. As to Plaintiffs' Takings Clause challenge, the district court offered only speculation on the economic impact of the challenged law and did not assess Plaintiffs' distinct investment-backed expectations for their LCMs. Therefore, I would conclude the district court exceeded the broad range of permissible conclusions it could have drawn from the record. The proper course is to reverse the district court's order granting the preliminary injunction and remand for further proceedings. Accordingly, I dissent.

As a final note, I realize the end result of the district court's rulings are temporary. The district court is to be commended for following our constant

admonition not to delay trial preparation awaiting an interim ruling on the preliminary injunction. *See Caribbean Marine Servs. Co., Inc. v. Baldrige*, 844 F.2d 668, 673 (9th Cir. 1988). The district court has properly proceeded with deliberate speed towards a trial, which will allow it to decide this case with a full and complete record and a new review. Thus, although I would reverse the district court's order and remand for further proceedings, I credit the district court for ensuring the case did not stall awaiting disposition of this appeal.

The Church of the Crossroads was founded in 1922 as Hawaii's first intentionally multiethnic church. We are a Just Peace Church of almost 200 members, and have voted unanimously to support this bill, with an amendment request below.

Hawai'i is the only state in the nation with an assault weapons ban that fails to ban assault rifles, assault shotguns and large magazines for those weapons. Our current law only applies to assault pistols/revolvers, and large detachable ammunition magazines (more than 10 rounds) for those weapons. This makes no sense and endangers us all. SB 2519 would finally ban all large capacity magazines, which is a big step in the right direction. However, to be much more effective, we request this bill be amended to also ban assault rifles and assault shotguns, as proposed in SB 1334.

Hawai'i is once again in grief from the senseless loss of life caused by gun violence. Our schools drill all our students each year on how to try to survive an active shooter situation. Yet our laws have gaping loopholes that facilitate gun violence. Thoughts and prayers are not enough to combat gun violence. Action is needed. The legislature must do its part by enacting safer gun laws that can reduce future risks of gun violence.

The 1994 federal Assault Weapons Ban prohibited a wide range of assault weapons and high-capacity magazines. It resulted in fewer mass shootings. Sadly, it was allowed to expire in 2004 and Congress has failed to re-enact it. Hawai'i can and should expand our own assault weapons law to fill this void.

Banning assault weapons and large capacity magazines is important because these weapons are uniquely designed to be capable of mass violence. Their potential for mass murder far outweighs any plausible use for hunting, recreation or self-defense. The rate of public mass shootings has tripled since 2011. The US now has more mass shootings each year than there are days in the year. Hawai'i has not been immune. We should do our best to prevent another mass shooting here. The sooner this ban is created, the sooner we can start reducing the needless spread of assault rifles and large capacity magazines in Hawai'i.

Dear Chair Nishihara, Vice Chair Wakai, and Members of the Committee:

Over the past decade, the five deadliest mass shooting incidents—Las Vegas, Orlando, Aurora, Sutherland Springs, and Parkland—have all involved the use of high-capacity magazines. These accessories can increase the lethality of many types of firearms, and have played a significant role in some of our country's deadliest mass shootings. That is why **I am urging you to support SB 2519** and extend Hawaii's law prohibiting high-capacity magazines to include rifle and shotgun magazines.

Hawaii has always been an important player in the gun safety movement. Currently, Hawaii's law prohibiting high-capacity magazines only applies to pistols. However, this bill, SB 2519, extends that prohibition to cover all high-capacity magazines. An Everytown original analysis of mass shootings from 2009 to 2018 revealed that, of the incidents with known magazine capacity data, 59 percent involved firearms with high-capacity magazines.¹ As a whole, the mass shootings we know involved the use of high-capacity magazines resulted in nearly five times as many people shot on average as those that did not.² The lawmakers of Hawaii have a chance to continue being at the forefront of the gun safety movement by supporting this piece of legislation and passing it through the legislature.

Thank you for the opportunity to testify today and the work you do to keep the people of Hawaii safe from gun violence. **I urge you to support SB 2519** and extend Hawaii's law to include the prohibition of rifle and shotgun magazines.

But remember, the Second amendment isn't about hunting, it's about the people's rights to protect themselves from threats both foreign and domestic.

Testimony in Opposition to SB2519 Related to Firearms Submitted February 3, 2020

I request the Hawaii State Legislature consider my opposition to **SB2519**, on the grounds that the bill diminishes the ability of legal gun owners to defend themselves in a home invasion scenario.

There can be no expectation that law-breaking criminals will obey any of the newly proposed gun control measures. These laws will only impact those that choose to abide by them. Furthermore, the importation of black-market firearms and parts (as with illegal drugs, fireworks, and other illicit items that continue to plague our state) will guarantee that ONLY those corrupt elements of society will have access to the very firearms that this bill seeks to ban, against a populace unequipped to defend against them.

Our law enforcement officers, while sincere in their desire to stop these criminals, will never be able to respond to a home invasion or similar assault until after the crime has commenced, to investigate and arrest the perpetrators after they have committed offenses. They will not arrive in time to defend us. It is our legal right and familial duty to be prepared to do so for ourselves. Anything less leaves us at the mercy of the bad guys.

Measures such as **SB2519**, seeking to place further restrictions on the magazine capacity for firearms, serve only to limit the ability of law-abiding citizens and responsible gun owners to defend themselves in situations where they face armed attackers. In armed confrontations involving trained police officers, dozens of rounds are often fired by officers, usually to stop solo perpetrators. Under the stress of the situation, missed shots are abundant, ineffective hits are prevalent, and the presence of drugs in the perpetrators' systems often prevents even lethal hits from stopping them in the short-term.

Private citizens facing attackers under less-than-ideal circumstances (i.e. late-night, unexpected, awakened from sleep) cannot be expected to perform more capably than professionally-trained and better-equipped law enforcement officers on duty. Quite the contrary, they will need the higher round capacities, currently only available in Hawaii in some rifles and shotguns due to current restrictions on handgun magazines, to defend themselves and their families. The expectation that a person awakened in the middle of the night can disable a single or multiple intruders with a single 10- (or fewer) round-limited magazine is unrealistic. The assumption that they could carry additional rounds in their sleepwear, or have the ability to reload under these circumstances, is absurd.

As a law-abiding, tax-paying, and voting citizen of Hawaii with 21 years of uniformed military service, I find it appalling that our elected representatives are considering measures to further limit my right to defend my family against the less civilized among us by enacting yet more restrictive gun ownership laws. Hawaii already has among the most restrictive and onerous gun control measures in the country.

I realize these new measures are in reaction to increased reports of gun crime, with pressure being brought to clamp down on the use of firearms in felonies. However these proposed laws only impact those that will obey them, not the criminals that threaten our decent citizens. Most of the violent offenders in these recent cases had multiple prior arrests and convictions for other crimes. Yet they still walked freely among us, having already chosen the path of anti-social, illegal, and violent behavior.

In a state where we cannot control the persistent importation of tons of illegal drugs and fireworks, what makes the Legislature believe that illegal guns and their components will not continue to readily

find their way into the hands of those that would use them to commit crimes? What good will be served by limiting the rights of Hawaii's law-abiding citizens to legally acquire and use firearms, as guaranteed by the 2nd Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, and reinforced in Hawaii's own State Constitution?

So please consider: It's 3am. The clash of a shattered window jolts you from sleep. You jump out of bed on bare feet, dressed only in loose-fitting bedclothes. Police response time is irrelevant, even if you have time to dial 911. You do not know how many people have entered your house, but can only assume they are armed and dangerous. Don't you wish you had a flashlight, a firearm, and more than 10 rounds of adequate caliber ammunition to defend your family? You can be certain that the law-breaking intruders, whose footfalls lumber toward the bedrooms, paid no heed to the latest Hawaii State gun laws.

RE: SB2519 : banning detachable ammunition magazines with a capacity in excess of 10 rounds

As a practicing orthopedic surgeon in Hawaii for 28 years, and before that for 5 years in inner-city Newark NJ, I am well experienced with caring for tragic gun trauma.

I urge you NOT to ban these 10+ round magazines for long guns.

The real harm outweighs the good intent.

New laws restricting the legal arming of our responsible citizens must be heavily weighed as to all the consequences, as well as the desired benefits.

Such a ban may *theoretically* have a marginal effect on preventing crime, but it definitely has a marginal effect on preventing the human right of meaningful self-defense by our citizens.

Such a magazine ban has already recently been blocked in California by San Diegobased U.S. District Judge Roger Benitez . His ruling is here:

Judge Benitez emphasizes that the Second Amendment requires that the state **has to meet a high burden before it can pass a law that infringes on the right to keep or bear arms**

Judge Benitez, in his ruling, specifically described three home invasions, two of which ended with the female victims running out of bullets.

In the third case, the pajama-clad woman with a high-capacity magazine took on three armed intruders, firing at them while simultaneously calling for help on her phone.

"She had no place to carry an extra magazine and no way to reload because her left hand held the phone with which she was still trying to call 911," the judge wrote, saying she killed one attacker while two escaped.

He ruled that magazines holding more than 10 rounds are "arms" under the U.S. Constitution, and that the California law "burdens the core of the Second Amendment by criminalizing the acquisition and possession of these magazines that are commonly held by law-abiding citizens for defense of self, home, and state."

The goal of the California law was to deter mass-shootings, such as the terrorist assault that killed 14 and injured 22 in San Bernardino. Hawaii has had no such comparable mass shootings.

Judge Benitez called such shootings "exceedingly rare" while emphasizing the numerous everyday robberies, rapes and murders that might be countered with firearms.

This exact issue will come before the Supreme Court to settle conflicting rulings, and it would be embarrassing for Hawaii to again have such a law reversed as unjust, unconstitutional. Police Chief Susan Ballard has already been cautioned once before by her own Police Commission about her present approach to the 2nd Amendment regarding permitting as being legally indefensible, and risks reprimand and reversal from SCOTUS. <u>https://www.staradvertiser.com/2019/04/02/hawaii-news/honolulu-police-chief-is-pressed-on-handgun-carry-permits/</u>

This potential ban is similarly at risk.

I strongly oppose SB2519. I have collected and handled various firearms safely for about 25 years and have also served as a law enforcement officer for about 20 years. I have received training and have practiced amateur gunsmithing and have competed in amateur marksmanship competitions throughout the 25 years that I have collected and handled firearms as well.

Many firearms come from the factory standard with magazines that carry 10 rounds or more and some of these firearms cannot be reasonably modified to comply with this law. There are many firearm magazines that cannot be modified to comply with this law.

The second amendment of the United States Constitution states: "A well regulated militia being necessary to the security of a free state, the right of the people to keep and bear arms shall not be infringed." To read this one must understand terms from the time it was written.

The phrase "well-regulated" was in common use long before 1789, and remained so for a century thereafter. It referred to the property of something being in proper working order. Something that was well-regulated was calibrated correctly, functioning as expected. It did not refer to strict government oversight of something.

The phrase "Militia" at the time referred to any able bodied adult male at the time. The founding fathers were against having a large standing army and expected all citizens to be prepared to stand together to fight when needed to keep our country secure.

The last part of the second amendment is very clear that the Government is prohibited from infringing upon the rights of the citizens to keep and bear arms. In District of Columbia v. Heller (2008), the Supreme Court affirmed for the first time that the right belongs to individuals, for self-defense in the home, while also including, that the right is not unlimited and does not preclude the existence of certain long-standing prohibitions such as those forbidding "the possession of firearms by felons and the mentally ill" or restrictions on "the carrying of dangerous and unusual weapons." State and local governments are limited to the same extent as the federal government from infringing upon this right.

The 9th circuit court is still currently hearing the case of Duncan v. Becerra where the court found in 2019 that the universal banning of magazines with a capacity of more than 10 rounds was unconstitutional. There is currently litigation still pending with this case but the likely final ruling will still be that "High Capacity Magazine Bans" are unconstitutional.

Magazines that have a capacity of 10 rounds or more are not "dangerous" or "unusual", as mentioned in the Heller case, and since the magazine is a component of a firearm required for certain firearms to function properly and banning their possession would be banning an individual the ability to keep or bear a firearm. SB2519 as written would violate the second amendment. When you accepted your elected office you took an oath to defend the Constitution. I urge you to obey your oath and vote against this unconstitutional bill from becoming a law.

This testimony is in opposition of SB2519 to limit the ammo capacity of all firearms in the state to a 10 round maximum. While I am submitting a written testimony I am unable to attend the hearing in person due to my work responsibilities that requires my physical presence, especially in the middle of the day at 1:15 PM. Within the last sentence of Section 1 it states "The purpose of this Act is to reduce gun violence in the State by prohibiting the use of large-capacity magazines in all types of firearms". Firstly, Giffords Law Center is hardly a credible source of information to base legislation off of; the FBI Uniform Crime Reports is widely considered the official data on crime in the USA, collected and published by the FBI. I briefly compared the Gifford and FBI statistics on gun violence and homicide and the Giffords statistics are using bogus data from the beginning. For more than half of the data points I personally checked, they are manipulating the raw data and presenting an end product where states with fewer gun laws conveniently show higher gun death rates. While this may sound like it makes sense at a glance, it is in fact an unfair statistic that was manipulated by Giffords, a biased anti-gun institution. How can elected officials be so easily tricked by an infographic, that's akin to listening to Boeing say the 737MAX is safe, believing them, and hopping on a flight. I beg of the legislature to please do more research prior to hearing this bill. But to be reasonable, in lieu of the gross misrepresentation of data by Giffords, can the State please provide unbiased statistics on the expected reduction in gun violence in the state as a direct result of this bill? As stated within SB2519 if the legislature is unable to produce credible statistics or information that correlates magazine capacity to gun violence then this bill is purely subjective. I do not believe that the democratic process should involve the creation of new laws based upon the feelings of a small group of individuals. We should be past the days of guessing if new legislature will be effective, we need to create laws that will create results in turn and SB2519 will fail to produce any results we so desparately need. Secondly, the quantity of magazines in excess of 10 rounds presently is definitely over 50,000 if not 100,000. SB2519 does not address those of us who currently own rifle magazines that have a capacity greater than 10 rounds. SB2519 does not address shotguns, the most violent close-range firearm, which have fixed manufactured magazine tubes that hold more than 10 rounds. SB2519 does not account for the financial burden that insituting the 10 round limit would have on firearm owners. Not only would firearm owners need to pay large sums of money to a gunsmith to have their magazines restricted, now we will also need to purchase a 20 round magazine as usual, but would then need to leave the magazine with a gunsmith while they restrict it. Lastly, and most importantly,

SB2519 does not account for the fact that most firearm manufacturers will not produce inventory that limits magazines to 10 rounds. Presently there are already firearms that Hawaii residents are simply unable to purchase due to the over-regulation that dissuades companies from having to go through all of the red tape and customization needed to import a firearm to Hawaii. Over the last 25 years that I have been a law-abiding firearms owner, I have collected several hundred dollars worth of these magazines because they are considered "standard capacity" rather than "high capacity" magazines. The State's decision to render these once legally owned items as contraband will hurt me fiscally.

In his 2019 decision striking down California's magazine ban, US District Court Judge Robert Benitez cited one case involving a woman who killed an attacker and two cases involving woman who ran out of ammunition as he declared the California law unconstitutional.

Please oppose SB2519. This bill would continue to punish law abiding citizens of the State of Hawaii and infringe upon their right to defend themselves in a manner which they deem acceptable. It would severely impact their ability while at home in the unfortunate event of a home invasion. It's the middle of the night and someone breaks in with the intent to cause physical harm. The bad actors have firearms obtained illegally and are a threat to you and your family, but you are limited to only 10 rounds in a magazine and have no way to carry extra magazines in your pajamas and you are calling 911 with your cellphone in your other hand. What do you do? It has been proven on many different occasions that standard capacity magazines made the difference between life and death for the law abiding citizen. Judge Roger Benitez from California declared magazine bans unconstitutional in his 2019 ruling. He ruled that magazines holding more than 10 rounds are "arms" under the U.S. Constitution, and that the...law "burdens the core of the Second Amendment by criminalizing the acquisition and possession of these magazines that are commonly held by law-abiding citizens for defense of self, home, and state."

Magazines that have capacities larger than 10 rounds were designed that way by the manufacturer for an explicit reason; to give the user the ability to defend oneself against bad actors with equality. To deviate from that would be redesigning the firearm from its initial and desired design. The Glock 17, which is the standard issue firearm for the Honolulu Police department, has a designed standard capacity of 17 rounds. The Colt AR-15 is the standard issue rifle of HPD, which is designed for use with 30 round capacity magazines. HPD officers routinely carry their own personal rifle with standard capacity 30 round magazines, that of itself does not afford any uniformity within the department and allows the individual officer to make undersigned modifications to their personal firearm which may place the department or City & County at risk. And as the proposed statute revision reads that law enforcement is exempt only in the performance in their official capacity (new section (d)). Will they be required to leave all magazines, rifle and pistol, that can hold more than 10 rounds at their respective armory and not allowed to bring them home? Is the intent of the statute to create two distinct classes of people in Hawaii? Is the safety of the Law Enforcement Officer more important than the safety of the law abiding citizen? That is what this statute is making. Law Enforcement Officers are civilians at all times and when off-duty they are not functioning in their official capacity and are subject to the statute.

Banning magazines with capacities of more than 10 rounds does nothing to address the real issues of crime in Hawaii and is only trying to fix a problem that doesn't exist. Banning larger-capacity ammunition magazines won't reduce the number of shootings, any more than banning alcohol reduced alcohol-related fatalities.

This bill would limit the possession of so-called "High Capacity" magazines for rifles to law enforcement use only. Currently, the law prohibits magazines or more than ten rounds in pistols.

Anti-gun groups around that nation like to say that reduced capacity magazines would save lives in a mass shooting, what they fail to mention is they would cost lives in self-defense.

The reason police officers are exempt in these laws is that they may face situations where there are multiple attackers. These situations don't occur in police stations, but in people's homes, businesses, and public places, where a law-abiding armed citizen would have to deal with the same situation. Running out of ammo in the middle of a threatening life situation is not something a police officer wants to do, nor does the average person.

Another thing that's often overlooked with the Second Amendment is the militia; you know the well-regulated part. Well regulated at the time of writing meant functioning or working correctly, For example, a clock that ran on time would be known as a well-regulated clock. Part of being well regulated would be making sure one is well equipped.

Hawaii Revised State 121-1 (4) contains the definition of "The unorganized militia." "The unorganized militia shall consist of those members of the militia who are not members of the national guard, the naval militia, or the state defense force. " (A)

Aloha,

While SB2519 attempts to bring the standard capacity of a firearm from it's original design to a reduced capacity of 10 rounds, the bill and its preceding handgun capacity ban is a Constitutional violation.

As ruled by the Supreme Court in both Heller v. DC and MacDonald v. City of Chicago, the 2nd Amendment does not limit firearms "in common use". I do not refer to this as a magazine ban precisely because the magazine IS NOT a separate part of the firearm. Instead, it is an integral part of the functional operation of the gun. Though removable, neither can function without the other. As such, when reviewing bills, the magazine must not be viewed as a separate entity, but as a whole firearm. That means that this is not a measure restricting a simple accessory, but a measuring restricting the firearm "in common use." As mentioned, the Court in both Heller and MacDonald ruled that governing bodies CANNOT restrict firearms "in common use."

There is no arguing that the AR15 style of rifle is the most popular and widely used firearm in the United States, and particularly here in Hawaii. That alone hammers the point that it is a firearm "in common use." By limiting the capacity of the firearm, the statute violates the 2nd Amendment simply on the basis of restricting the functionality of a firearm "in common use."

The reasoning I am giving is not a new or novel ideal. Recently, based on this exact reasoning, U.S. District Court Judge Roger Benitez has already struck down California's ban on +10 magazines. Pending the Supreme Court ruling on City of New York v. New York State Rifle and Pistol Association, the California magazine ban will be struck down. As will any others, including Hawaii's, should this bill advance.

Also, I strongly object to the proposed exemption for law enforcement. As much as I admire the police department and support them, they are us and we are them. They are not a militarized force. They indeed have a paramilitary style unit aka SWAT/SSD, but the rest of the force are made up of citizens. As such, an exemption for law enforcement officers violates the equal protection clause. Should you pass this measure, law enforcement agencies should not be exempt for this statute.

With HUNDREDS OF THOUSANDS of rifle magazines in the State of Hawaii, legislation of this magnitude would be nearly impossible, and make instant criminals of law abiding citizens. I strongly urge the committee to defer this measure on the basis that it is a direct violation of both the Heller and MacDonald SCOTUS rulings and pending the outcome of the NYC v. NYSRPA case currently before the Court.

SB2519/HB1902 - RELATING TO FIREARMS. Prohibits the manufacture, possession, sale, barter, trade, gift, transfer, or acquisition of detachable ammunition magazines with a capacity in excess of ten rounds, regardless of the type of firearm with which the magazine is compatible. Makes an exception for possession and use by law enforcement agencies and officers.

This bill would continue to punish law abiding citizens of the State of Hawaii and infringe upon their right to defend themselves in a manner which they deem acceptable. It would severely impact their ability while at home in the unfortunate event of a home invasion. It's the middle of the night and someone breaks in with the intent to cause physical harm. The bad actors have firearms obtained illegally and are a threat to you and your family, but you are limited to only 10 rounds in a magazine and have no way to carry extra magazines in your pajamas and you are calling 911 with your cellphone in your other hand. What do you do? It has been proven on many different occasions that standard capacity magazines made the difference between life and death for the law abiding citizen. Judge Roger Benitez from California declared magazine bans unconstitutional in his 2019 ruling. He ruled that magazines holding more than 10 rounds are "arms" under the U.S. Constitution, and that the... ...law "burdens the core of the Second Amendment by criminalizing the acquisition and possession of these magazines that are commonly held by law-abiding citizens for defense of self, home, and state."

Magazines that have capacities larger than 10 rounds were designed that way by the manufacturer for an explicit reason; to give the user the ability to defend oneself against bad actors with equality. To deviate from that would be redesigning the firearm from its initial and desired design. The Glock 17, which is the standard issue firearm for the Honolulu Police department, has a designed standard capacity of 17 rounds. The Colt AR-15 is the standard issue rifle of HPD, which is designed for use with 30 round capacity magazines. HPD officers routinely carry their own personal rifle with standard capacity 30 round magazines, that of itself does not afford any uniformity within the department and allows the individual officer to make undersigned modifications to their personal firearm which may place the department or City & County at risk. And as the proposed statute revision reads that law enforcement is exempt only in the performance

in their official capacity (new section (d)). Will they be required to leave **all** magazines, rifle and pistol, that can hold more than 10 rounds at their respective armory and not allowed to bring them home? Is the intent of the statute to create two distinct classes of people in Hawaii? Is the safety of the Law Enforcement Officer more important than the safety of the law abiding citizen? That is what this statute is making. Law Enforcement Officers are civilians at all times and when off-duty they are not functioning in their official capacity and are subject to the statute.

Banning magazines with capacities of more than 10 rounds does nothing to address the real issues of crime in Hawaii and is only trying to fix a problem that doesn't exist. Banning larger-capacity ammunition magazines won't reduce the number of shootings, any more than banning alcohol reduced alcohol-related fatalities.

I urge you to oppose this measure and to work to repeal the current law of pistol magazine restrictions for the safety and welfare of Hawaii residents.

Prohibits the manufacture, possession, sale, barter, trade, gift, transfer, or acquisition of detachable ammunition magazines with a capacity in excess of ten rounds, regardless of the type of firearm with which the magazine is compatible. Makes an exception for possession and use by law enforcement agencies and officers. This bill would continue to punish law abiding citizens of the State of Hawaii and infringe upon their right to defend themselves in a manner which they deem acceptable. It would severely impact their ability while at home in the unfortunate event of a home invasion. It's the middle of the night and someone breaks in with the intent to cause physical harm. The bad actors have firearms obtained illegally and are a threat to you and your family, but you are limited to only 10 rounds in a magazine and have no way to carry extra magazines in your pajamas and you are calling 911 with your cellphone in your other hand. What do you do? It has been proven on many different occasions that standard capacity magazines made the difference between life and death for the law abiding citizen. Judge Roger Benitez from California declared magazine bans unconstitutional in his 2019 ruling. He ruled that magazines holding more than 10 rounds are "arms" under the U.S. Constitution, and that the....law "burdens the core of the Second Amendment by criminalizing the acquisition and possession of these magazines that are commonly held by law-abiding citizens for defense of self, home, and state."

Magazines that have capacities larger than 10 rounds were designed that way by the manufacturer for an explicit reason; to give the user the ability to defend oneself against bad actors with equality. To deviate from that would be redesigning the firearm from its initial and desired design. The Glock 17, which is the standard issue firearm for the Honolulu Police department, has a designed standard capacity of 17 rounds. The Colt AR-15 is the standard issue rifle of HPD, which is designed for use with 30 round capacity magazines. HPD officers routinely carry their own personal rifle with standard capacity 30 round magazines, that of itself does not afford any uniformity within the department and allows the individual officer to make undersigned modifications to their personal firearm which may place the department or City & County at risk. And as the proposed statute revision reads that law enforcement is exempt only in the performance in their official capacity (new section (d)). Will they be required to leave all magazines, rifle and pistol, that can hold more than 10 rounds at their respective armory and not allowed to bring them home? Is the intent of the statute to create two distinct classes of people in Hawaii? Is the safety of the Law Enforcement Officer more important than the safety of the law abiding citizen? That is what this statute is making. Law Enforcement Officers are civilians at all times and when off-duty they are not functioning in their official capacity and are subject to the statute.

Banning magazines with capacities of more than 10 rounds does nothing to address the real issues of crime in Hawaii and is only trying to fix a problem that doesn't exist. Banning larger-capacity ammunition magazines won't reduce the number of shootings, any more than banning alcohol reduced alcohol-related fatalities.

I urge you to oppose this measure and to work to repeal the current law of pistol magazine

It would severely impact their ability while at home in the unfortunate event of a home invasion. It's the middle of the night and someone breaks in with the intent to cause physical harm. The bad actors have firearms obtained illegally and are a threat to you and your family, but you are limited to only 10 rounds in a magazine and have no way to carry extra magazines in your pajamas and you are calling 911 with your cellphone in your other hand. What do you do? It has been proven on many different occasions that standard capacity magazines made the difference between life and death for the law abiding citizen. Judge Roger Benitez from California declared magazine bans unconstitutional in his 2019 ruling. He ruled that magazines holding more than 10 rounds are "arms" under the U.S. Constitution, and that the... ...law "burdens the core of the Second Amendment by criminalizing the acquisition and possession of these magazines that are commonly held by law-abiding citizens for defense of self, home, and state."

Magazines that have capacities larger than 10 rounds were designed that way by the manufacturer for an explicit reason; to give the user the ability to defend oneself against bad actors with equality. To deviate from that would be redesigning the firearm from its initial and desired design. The Glock 17, which is the standard issue firearm for the Honolulu Police department, has a designed standard capacity of 17 rounds. The Colt AR-15 is the standard issue rifle of HPD, which is designed for use with 30 round capacity magazines. HPD officers routinely carry their own personal rifle with standard capacity 30 round magazines, that of itself does not afford any uniformity within the department and allows the individual officer to make undersigned modifications to their personal firearm which may place the department or City & County at risk. And as the proposed statute revision reads that law enforcement is exempt only in the performance in their official capacity (new section (d)). Will they be required to leave all magazines, rifle and pistol, that can hold more than 10 rounds at their respective armory and not allowed to bring them home? Is the intent of the statute to create two distinct classes of people in Hawaii? Is the safety of the Law Enforcement Officer more important than the safety of the law abiding citizen? That is what this statute is making. Law Enforcement Officers are civilians at all times and when off-duty they are not functioning in their official capacity and are subject to the statute.

Banning magazines with capacities of more than 10 rounds does nothing to address the real issues of crime in Hawaii and is only trying to fix a problem that doesn't exist. Banning larger-capacity ammunition magazines won't reduce the number of shootings, any more than banning alcohol reduced alcohol-related fatalities.

I urge you to oppose this measure and to work to repeal the current law of pistol magazine restrictions for the safety and welfare of Hawaii residents.

This bill would continue to punish law abiding citizens of the State of Hawaii and infringe upon their right to defend themselves in a manner which they deem acceptable. It would severely impact their ability while at home in the unfortunate event of a home invasion. It's the middle of the night and someone breaks in with the intent to cause physical harm. The bad actors have firearms obtained illegally and are a threat to you and your family, but you are limited to only 10 rounds in a magazine and have no way to carry extra magazines in your pajamas and you are calling 911 with your cellphone in your other hand. What do you do? It has been proven on many different occasions that standard capacity magazines made the difference between life and death for the law abiding citizen. Judge Roger Benitez from California declared magazine bans unconstitutional in his 2019 ruling. He ruled that magazines holding more than 10 rounds are "arms" under the U.S. Constitution, and that the... ...law "burdens the core of the Second Amendment by criminalizing the acquisition and possession of these magazines that are commonly held by law-abiding citizens for defense of self, home, and state."

Magazines that have capacities larger than 10 rounds were designed that way by the manufacturer for an explicit reason; to give the user the ability to defend oneself against bad actors with equality. To deviate from that would be redesigning the firearm from its initial and desired design. The Glock 17, which is the standard issue firearm for the Honolulu Police department, has a designed standard capacity of 17 rounds. The Colt AR-15 is the standard issue rifle of HPD, which is designed for use with 30 round capacity magazines. HPD officers routinely carry their own personal rifle with standard capacity 30 round magazines, that of itself does not afford any uniformity within the department and allows the individual officer to make undersigned modifications to their personal firearm which may place the department or City & County at risk. And as the proposed statute revision reads that law enforcement is exempt only in the performance in their official capacity (new section (d)). Will they be required to leave all magazines, rifle and pistol, that can hold more than 10 rounds at their respective armory and not allowed to bring them home? Is the intent of the statute to create two distinct classes of people in Hawaii? Is the safety of the Law Enforcement Officer more important than the safety of the law abiding citizen? That is what this statute is making. Law Enforcement Officers are civilians at all times and when off-duty they are not functioning in their official capacity and are subject to the statute.

Banning magazines with capacities of more than 10 rounds does nothing to address the real issues of crime in Hawaii and is only trying to fix a problem that doesn't exist. Banning larger-capacity ammunition magazines won't reduce the number of shootings, any more than banning alcohol reduced alcohol-related fatalities.

I urge you to oppose this measure and to work to repeal the current law of pistol magazine restrictions for the safety and welfare of Hawaii residents.

SB2635 - RELATING TO FIREARMS AMMUNITION. Requires the licensing of sellers of ammunition, and for the identification and proper permitting of purchasers or possessors of ammunition. Regulates ammunition in the same manner that firearms are regulated. This bill would punish law abiding firearms owners both within and without the State of Hawaii.

1. This would greatly hurt the hunting tourism industry of Hawaii as hunters who come to Hawaii for weekend hunts would not be able to purchase any ammunition for their firearms. Such restrictions would greatly impact the finances of small and large hunting guides as hunters would go to other places to hunt and take their wallets with them. This would also affect the greater tourism industry as the hunters may bring their family members to Hawaii to vacation while they hunt. This revenue stream would go away, leading to job loss and decreased earnings to businesses and subsequent tax revenue loss.

2. This would hurt the organizations such as the Boy Scouts and other such organizations that provide learning opportunities for youth to learn safely about firearms. Using the Boy Scouts, typically, one adult leader purchases the ammunition for their entire troop to use at the event. The firearms are owned by the Boy Scouts organization, not the individual. That would make the ammunition purchaser a criminal as he/she would not be purchasing ammunition for their registered firearm. How would they purchase ammunition? Purchasing ammunition for firearms not registered to the individual would in essence constitute a "straw purchase", making all involved criminals. Now that group is disenfranchised from a Constitutionally protected event and the youth are not afforded the ability to learn SAFELY about firearms. Todays youth are tomorrows leaders.

3. Todays firearms are more and more available as multi calibers. To the point where manufacturers are marking them as MULTI. There are factory kits available for firearms to convert calibers. These are designed by the manufacturer. The manufacturer SIG has the P320 and P250 pistols available as 9mm, .40, .357SIG with different conversion kits. The "firearm" of the SIG is just the "Fire Control Unit" How does an owner procure ammunition for these firearms if it was not originally registered as a certain caliber? To enact this places an undue burden on the firearm owner. How is law enforcement set up to easily and conveniently help firearms owners? Will owners have to re-register a firearm for every caliber if they choose to change?

4. This statute change does not address shooting events where firearms owners gather together to engage in a legally protected activity. When an individual runs out of his own ammunition, he is barred from borrowing ammunition from his friends, even though all persons are legal possessors of firearms. And should the event occur where borrowing or giving of ammunition would occur, all involved would be made into criminals. Why are we criminalizing legally protected activities?

As such for these and many other reasons, I urge you to OPPOSE this bill.

This bill punishes law abiding citizens of the State of Hawaii and infringe upon their right to defend themselves in a manner which they deem acceptable. It would severely impact their ability while at home in the unfortunate event of a home invasion. It's the middle of the night and someone breaks in with the intent to cause physical harm. The bad actors have firearms obtained illegally and are a threat to you and your family, but you are limited to only 10 rounds in a magazine and have no way to carry extra magazines in your pajamas and you are calling 911 with your cellphone in your other hand. What do you do? It has been proven on many different occasions that standard capacity magazines made the difference between life and death for the law abiding citizen. Judge Roger Benitez from California declared magazine bans unconstitutional in his 2019 ruling. He ruled that magazines holding more than 10 rounds are "arms" under the U.S. Constitution, and that the... ...law "burdens the core of the Second Amendment by criminalizing the acquisition and possession of these magazines that are commonly held by law-abiding citizens for defense of self, home, and state."

Magazines that have capacities larger than 10 rounds were designed that way by the manufacturer for an explicit reason; to give the user the ability to defend oneself against bad actors with equality. To deviate from that would be redesigning the firearm from its initial and desired design. The Glock 17, which is the standard issue firearm for the Honolulu Police department, has a designed standard capacity of 17 rounds. The Colt AR-15 is the standard issue rifle of HPD, which is designed for use with 30 round capacity magazines. HPD officers routinely carry their own personal rifle with standard capacity 30 round magazines, that of itself does not afford any uniformity within the department and allows the individual officer to make undersigned modifications to their personal firearm which may place the department or City & County at risk. And as the proposed statute revision reads that law enforcement is exempt only in the performance in their official capacity (new section (d)). Will they be required to leave all magazines, rifle and pistol, that can hold more than 10 rounds at their respective armory and not allowed to bring them home? Is the intent of the statute to create two distinct classes of people in Hawaii? Is the safety of the Law Enforcement Officer more important than the safety of the law abiding citizen? That is what this statute is making. Law Enforcement Officers are civilians at all times and when off-duty they are not functioning in their official capacity and are subject to the statute.

Banning magazines with capacities of more than 10 rounds does nothing to address the real issues of crime in Hawaii and is only trying to fix a problem that doesn't exist. Banning larger-capacity ammunition magazines won't reduce the number of shootings, any more than banning alcohol reduced alcohol-related fatalities.

I urge you to oppose this measure and to work to repeal the current law of pistol magazine restrictions for the safety and welfare of Hawaii residents.

During officer involved shootings, officers nation wide hit their intended targets on average 34% of the time. Many departments find that it is justifiable for officers to use 10-12 rounds to eliminate a threat, oftentimes with multiple officers discharging their weapons. This bill is in essence requiring myself or my wife, to wake up from a dead sleep, recognize a threat, be able to access a means of defense in time, and possibly use 10 rounds with the hope that she comes close to the average hit rate of police nationwide. Because the alternative is that my family is either murdered, maimed, kidnapped, or raped; or become a felony by using an over 10 round magazine to increase the odds of protecting ourselves. Dear Senate Committee on Public Safety, Intergovernmental, and Military Affairs,

I am writing in support of this bill to ban large capacity magazines for rifles and shotguns.

Hawaii law is the only state in the nation to have an assault weapons ban that fails to include assault rifles/shotguns, and large capacity magazines (over 10 rounds) for those weapons. Assault weapons and large capacity magazines are uniquely designed to be capable of mass violence. Their potential for mass murder far outweighs any plausible use for hunting, recreation or self-defense.

Hawai'i is once again in grief from the senseless loss of life caused by gun violence. Thoughts and prayers are not enough to combat gun violence. Action is needed.

Our keiki are drilled each year on how to try to survive an active shooter situation. Legislators must do their part by enacting safer gun laws to reduce this risk, particularly from large capacity magazines and assault weapons.

1994 federal Assault Weapons Ban prohibited assault weapons and high-capacity magazines and resulted in fewer mass shootings, but the law expired and Congress has failed to re-enact it. Hawai'i can and should enact our own laws to ban these large capacity magazines and weapons. This bill should be amended to also ban assault rifles and assault shotguns, as has been done by all other states that have adopted assault weapons laws.

The rate of public mass shootings has tripled since 2011. The US now has more mass shootings each year than there are days in the year. Hawai'i has not been immune. We should do our best to prevent another mass shooting here.

The sooner assault weapons and large capacity magazines are banned, the sooner we can start reducing the needless spread of these dangerous weapons in Hawai'i.

My name is Keith Kawamoto and I am a law-abiding individual who enjoys competing with firearms. I fire hundreds of cartridges a month to punch holes in cardboard while participating in organized matches. Hawaii's current magazine capacity laws have gutted most of the divisions of competition. Pistol Caliber Carbine is the only division that we have the use of standard capacity rifle magazine. As a result of this freedom of capacity, several local shooters have attained the highest competitive rankings at the national level. I myself am close to attaining such a standing. I strongly oppose SB2519 to restrict LCM for rifles.

Hawaii has "the strongest gun safety laws in the nation," yet law makers have not fully examined the impact that this bill will have on military personnel stationed in Hawaii. As a member of the Hawaii National Guard I have LCM that I use to train with to maintain my marksmanship skills, knowledge, and abilities. I also employ the LCM in marksmanship competitions hosted by the National Guard Bureau both locally and on the continental US. LCM is part of my battle gear and vital for my survival when ordered into harm's way.

I also believe that my rights as law-abiding gun owner when I am not in uniform will not be restricted. I swore an oath to defend the Constitution of the United States and believe that the second amendment is a right I need to defend because "the right to bear arms shall not be infringed."

Why would this bill "only" allow Law Enforcement officers to possess LCM? They should be subject to the same laws off-duty as any other law-abiding gun owner. There is no plausible reason why possession of LCM should not be the same across the board. One would perceive this as the state's abuse of power over one sector of the population, the law-abiding gun owners.

This proposed act "to reduce gun violence in the state by eliminating the use of large capacity magazines in all types of firearms, not just pistols" will cause financial hardship to law-abiding gun owners "without any evidence of improvements in public safety." A magazines capacity can vary depending on caliber used. "For example, a certain magazine often affiliated with the AR-15 will hold 30 rounds of 5.56 mm ammunition but only 10 rounds of the larger .458 SOCOM ammunition.

It has been ruled, "District of Columbia v. Heller, the Second Amendment protects an individual's right to keep and bear arms. By implication, that right is not limited to guns but extends also to the ammunition and magazines that make guns operable. The Court also held that the Second Amendment protects arms in "common use," which would cover the 20-round magazines that are standard equipment for a significant portion of weapons currently in lawful use. Finally, "the Supreme Court has said that the Second Amendment extends to all instruments that constitute bearable arms in common use."

Limiting LCM has no bearing on the "time it takes for a shooter (criminal) to reload his weapon." Magazine capacity has a complicated and nonlinear relationship with practical rate of fire. The Virginia Tech shooter changed his 10-round magazines a total of 17 times. The Parkland shooter reportedly fired 150 rounds over the course of about seven minutes, reportedly using 10-round magazines that would be compliant with almost every current and proposed magazine restriction.

I humbly demand that the Committee on Public Safety, Veterans, & Military Affairs not vote to move SB2519 any further.
