Chair Tarnas and Members of the Committee:

The Department of the Attorney General provides the following comments.

This bill amends section 11-151, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to specify that ballots cast in the ratification of a proposed constitutional amendment may be counted as negative votes if the ballot properly indicates that the vote is in the negative; no other indication on the ballot, such as a blank or a cross-out shall counted as negative.

This amendment comports with the Hawaii Supreme Court decision in *Hawai'i State AFL-CIO v. Yoshina*, 84 Hawai'i 374, 935 P.2d 89 (1997), which found blank votes and over-votes are not directly counted in the "negative" against a proposed amendment.

We note that the court in *Yoshina* held that the total number of "ballots cast' within the meaning of article XVII, section 2 of the Hawaii Constitution, includes blank ballots and over votes." *Id.* at 383, 935 P.2d at 98. The total number of votes cast in an election is distinct from the tallied "yes" votes and "no" votes, and that total is considered when applying the two-part test for constitutional amendment ratification as set forth in article XVII, section 2, of the Hawaii Constitution and *Yoshina*.

Article XVII, section 2, states in part:

The revision or amendments shall be effective only if approved at a general election by a majority of all the votes *tallied* upon the question, this majority constituting at least fifty per cent of the total vote *cast* at the

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> election, or at a special election by a majority of all the votes tallied upon the question, this majority constituting at least thirty per cent of the total number of registered voters. [Emphases added.]

For *tally* purposes, ballots containing neither a "yes" vote nor a "no" vote (e.g., "blank" votes, crossed out, defaced, and "over" votes) are not counted as "yes" or "no" votes, but are still treated as *cast* ballots. Thus, a proposed constitutional amendment will succeed when it garners a majority of tallied votes in the form of "yes" votes for approval, with those "yes" votes constituting at least fifty percent of the total votes cast.

While there do not appear to be legal problems with this bill, the addition of section 11-151(b), HRS, in this bill might *appear* to conflict with article XVII, section 2, and the *Yoshina* case. Therefore, we recommend the following amendments to the proposed wording of subsection (b) on page 2, lines 14-18:

(b) Each vote cast in ratification of a constitutional amendment <u>or a</u> <u>question for a constitutional convention</u> shall be counted in the negative only if the ballot properly indicates that the vote is in the negative. No other indication on the ballot, including but not limited to a blank or crossout, shall be counted in the negative[-]; provided that the ballots cast, whether voted, blank, spoiled, or otherwise invalid, shall be counted towards the total number of votes cast.

Furthermore, to avoid redundant provisions, we recommend amending subsection (a)(3) on page 2, lines 7-13, as follows:

(3) [If] <u>Unless otherwise provided by law, if</u> a contest or question requires a majority of the votes for passage, any blank, spoiled, or invalid ballot shall not be tallied for passage or as votes cast [except such ballots shall be counted as votes cast in ratification of a constitutional amendment or a question for a constitutional convention].

We respectfully ask the Committee to consider our recommended amendments. Thank you for the opportunity to provide these comments.

Chair Tarnas, Vice Chair Takayama, and JHA Committee members, I oppose this bill because it is poorly written in an attempt to clarify counting votes only in the negative . While the bill adds new language clarifying what constitutes a negative vote cast in SECTION 2, (3). (b), it retains current language counting blank, spoiled or invalid ballots for a question for a constitutional convention. See below:

(3) If a contest or question requires a majority of the votes for passage, any blank, spoiled, or invalid ballot shall not be tallied for passage or as votes cast except that [such] the ballots shall be counted as votes cast in [ratification of a constitutional amendment or] question for a constitutional convention.

While the new section clarifies what constitutes a negative ballot, the above section language retains a negative ballot for blank, spoiled or invalid ballots for a constitutional convention. This is inconsistent with the intent of this bill. Moreover, this proposal is not necessary. To avoid legislation of this kind, a simple solution is to have all future ballot questions be written clearer with simple language for the voter to understand that blank, spoiled, or invalid ballots shall be counted as a negative vote .

For these reasons, I oppose this legislation as written.
