RELATING TO THE HAWAII COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

The Department of Budget and Finance (B&F) offers comments on this bill.

House Bill (H.B.) No. 1781, H.D. 2, establishes the Panaewa Community

Development District (PCDD) under the Hawai'i Community Development Authority

(HCDA) to allow for the planning, development, and maintenance of public lands in

Panaewa, Hawai'i; establishes the Panaewa Community Development District Special

Fund (PCDDSF) for HCDA to administrate and operate the PCDD; and amends the

membership of the HCDA to include representatives for the PCDD. The PCDDSF

would generate revenue from the PCDD, legislative appropriations, and by collecting

other funds from government agencies and private individuals or organizations.

As a matter of general policy, B&F does not support the creation of any special fund which does not meet the requirements of Section 37-52.3, HRS. Special funds should: 1) serve a need as demonstrated by the purpose, scope of work, and an explanation why the program cannot be implemented successfully under the general fund appropriation process; 2) reflect a clear nexus between the benefits sought and

charges made upon the users or beneficiaries or a clear link between the program and the sources of revenue; 3) provide an appropriate means of financing for the program or activity; and 4) demonstrate the capacity to be financially self-sustaining. Regarding H.B. No. 1781, H.D. 2, it is difficult to determine whether the proposed special fund would be self-sustaining.
