HB 2684 HD1- RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII AT HILO

Chair Yamashita, Vice Chair Kitagawa, and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for this opportunity to submit testimony on HB 2684 HD1. The University of Hawai'i at Hilo (UH Hilo) supports the passage of HB 2684 HD1, which seeks to establish the Institute of Indigenous Education, Science, and Outreach (Institute) to be placed within UH Hilo through a collaboration between the UH Hilo 'Imiloa Astronomy Center ('Imiloa) and the UH Hilo college of Hawaiian language, Ka Haka 'Ula O Ke'elikōlani (CoHL).

The legislature established the CoHL under HRS §§ 304A-1301-1302 in 1997, the functions of which include providing a quality education primarily through the medium of the Hawaiian language, as well as the incorporation of Nāwahīokalani'ōpu'u School and other laboratory schools, that now includes three other K-12 charter schools as well as all the 'Aha Pūnana Leo's ('APL) 13 Hawaiian Medium preschools throughout the state.

CoHL faculty and administrators worked alongside community members and agencies to help establish 'Imiloa as an extension of its work to advance the Hawaiian language. 'Imiloa opened its doors in 2006 and is the only bi-lingual science Center in Hawai'i and has become a national and international model for indigenous informal science education, serving its community through local science research, cultural advancement, and environmental stewardship. 'Imiloa has become a critical gathering place for practitioners and scholars, fostering collaborative efforts to advance science education from an indigenous foundation and perspective.

The Institute established by HB 2684 HD1 will further solidify the relationship between 'Imiloa and the CoHL, along with its laboratory schools and community partners. The streamlining of operations and the flexibility of scheduling, outreach, and functionality will further the impact of these units. UH Hilo has found that both 'Imiloa and the College face many unique situations that require agility to address the State's Hawaiian language needs. Among such things are scheduling courses outside the standard university semesters to provide curriculum and instruction to PreK-12 institutions, teaching at the College's laboratory school program in areas where there are gaps in instruction, utilizing upper-division college students to teach lower division/dual credit courses in beginning Hawaiian for English medium high school students, and being able

to provide outreach to learners with distinctive ties to the State as well as institutions, organizations and agencies looking for support with furthering the learning, use and normalization of the Hawaiian language.

This consortium provides services and support to Hawaiian Language schools and programs statewide via its curriculum and materials development, pre- and in-service teacher training. To further bolster the statewide impact and benefit of the Institute's work, we offer suggested amendments to HB 2684 HD1 that address two accounts currently available to the CoHL's Hale Kuamo'o and 'Imiloa. Expanding the scope of the sources of revenue these funds can take in, and the purposes for which the funds can be used will allow for a more sustainable model for the Institute's programming.

HB 2682, also before this committee today, provides for this expanded scope of those two accounts. The Attorney General has brought to light however a constitutional concern with the title of HB 2682.

Given the two accounts are relative to UH Hilo and this bill, HB 2684 HD1 is "RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII AT HILO," we are requesting that HB 2684 HD1 be amended to include the contents of HB 2682.

Aloha Chair Yamashita, Vice Chair Kitagawa and members of the Committee on Finance,

The 'Aha Pūnana Leo strongly supports HB 2684 HD 1 Relating to the University of Hawai'i.

My name is Kaʻiulani Laehā, Chief Executive Officer of the 'Aha Pūnana Leo. With 13 language nest, child care centers in all counties of Hawaiʻi, the 'Aha Pūnana Leo is the only statewide provider of Hawaiian medium early childhood programs and education. We stand on 40 years of experience in language revitalization and early childhood related programs.

Ka Haka 'Ula o Ke'elikōlani, the state Hawaiian language college, works with 'Aha Pūnana Leo to provide early childhood teacher training, language fluency development, curriculum development, assessments and action research. Together with the public charter Ke Kula 'o Nāwahīokalani'ōpu'u and the college we demonstrate a Hawaiian medium education pathway from infant-toddler through doctoral degree education. Since 2005, the 'Aha Pūnana Leo has conducted its annual 'Aha Nu'ukia statewide professional development for all staff in which laboratory schools of the college throughout the state benefit from the intense weeklong training. We share an educational philosophy Ke Kumu Honua Mauli Ola that guides our work. Aligning Ka Haka 'Ula o Ke'elikōlani with 'Imiloa Center into a single institute will increase support for the laboratory school program and further support indigenous language revitalization in Hawai'i and beyond.

One of our most significant challenges in language revitalization work, especially seen in language nest programs, is the dire need for kumu proficient in the language. This bill seeks to move the college and 'Imiloa into an institute model that would allow for the great need to support obtaining higher language proficiency among new teachers; we are constantly seeking kumu (teachers) with high proficiency in 'Ōlelo Hawai'i throughout the school year.

The establishment of our current P-25 Hawaiian language medium pathway was revolutionary for native language revitalization efforts on a national level; establishing an institute of indigenous education, science and outreach is the next groundbreaking step needed to help us regain a normalized Hawaiian language and remain a national and global leader in native language education.

We urge you to support this bill.
