3 Department Testimony: The Adult Mental Health Division (AMHD) provides the following

4 testimony on behalf of the Department.

5 The Department expresses its support for HB2800, which proposes the establishment of 6 an Advisory Committee on Mental Health Code Review in the State of Hawaii.

The Legislature rightly recognizes that the chapters relating to mental health have been
amended in a piecemeal manner over the past several decades, leading to some lack of clarity
and inconsistencies. Establishing a regular and systematic review, as proposed in this bill, is
essential to maintaining the coherence and effectiveness of mental health laws.

The bill takes inspiration from the comprehensive reviews conducted every decade for the Hawaii Penal Code since its enactment in 1972. This reflects a commitment to best practices in legal governance and underscores the importance of periodic assessments for ensuring the relevance and efficacy of mental health laws.

15 The proposed composition of the advisory committee includes key stakeholders such as 16 the Director of Health, Attorney General, representatives from relevant departments, judiciary, legislative bodies, and community organizations. This diverse representation ensures a holistic
 and informed perspective in the review process.

The bill outlines a clear scope for the advisory committee's review, encompassing federal and state court cases, constitutional, statutory, and rule changes impacting the Hawaii Revised Statutes related to mental health. This comprehensive approach ensures that the review is thorough and addresses emerging issues.

7 The requirement for the advisory committee to submit a report of its findings and 8 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the legislature adds a layer of 9 transparency and accountability. This ensures that the insights gained from the review are 10 translated into actionable measures for the benefit of mental health in the state.
