#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROTECTIVE ORDERS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Chapter 28, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
 by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and to read
 as follows:

4 "PART HAWAII HOPE CARD PROGRAM 5 §28-A Hawaii hope card program. (a) There is established 6 within the department of the attorney general a program to be known as the Hawaii hope card program, which shall be 7 8 responsible for issuing hope cards to holders of a long term 9 protective order to allow law enforcement to quickly verify the 10 existence of the long term protective order and easily obtain 11 information regarding the long term protective order.

(b) The department of the attorney general shall employ, without regard to chapter 76, a coordinator and an assistant to the coordinator and other personnel as necessary to promote the effective and efficient conduct of the Hawaii hope card program's activities.

(b) Access to the database shall be provided twenty-four hours a day, seven days per week for the duration of the long term protective order by internet and telephone for which the department of the attorney general shall maintain a Hawaii phone number; provided that the identity of the applicant shall not be listed where the long term protective order has been obtained under section 604-10.5(e).

There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 11 or so much 12 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016 and the 13 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 14 2016-2017, to be deposited into the Hawaii hope card program 15 special fund. 16 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the Hawaii hope 17 card program special fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2015-2016, for the 18 19 department of the attorney general to administer the Hawaii hope 20 card program.

21 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department22 of the attorney general for the purposes of this Act.



1 SECTION 4. The department of the attorney general shall 2 develop and implement the Hawaii hope card program established 3 by section 1 of this Act no later than January 1, 2016. 4. SECTION 5. In codifying the new sections added by section 5 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating 6 7 the new sections in this Act.
