A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SELECTIVE SERVICE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature recognizes that sufficient
- 2 armed strength must be achieved and maintained to insure the
- 3 security of the United States. In a free society, the
- 4 obligations and privileges of serving in the armed forces and
- 5 the reserve components should be shared in accordance with a
- 6 system of selection that is fair and just, and consistent with
- 7 maintaining an effective national economy.
- 8 The legislature finds that to achieve these national
- 9 security goals, the United States Congress has enacted the
- 10 United States Military Selective Service Act (50 U.S.C. App. 451
- 11 et seq.), which requires all male citizens and males residing in
- 12 the United States, except for lawfully admitted non-immigrants,
- 13 to register with the Selective Service System upon reaching the
- 14 age of eighteen.
- 15 The legislature further finds that any person who is not in
- 16 compliance with the Military Selective Service Act is ineligible
- 17 for federal student financial assistance and employment within
- 18 the executive branch of the federal government.



- 1 The purpose of this Act is to require compliance with the
- 2 Military Selective Service Act to be eligible for enrollment in
- 3 a state-supported post-secondary institution, qualify for state
- 4 financial assistance for post-secondary education, or be
- 5 eligible for state or county employment or service.
- 6 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
- 7 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
- 8 as follows:
- 9 "CHAPTER
- 10 SELECTIVE SERVICE REGISTRATION AWARENESS AND COMPLIANCE ACT
- 11 § -1 Short title. This chapter shall be known as the
- 12 "Selective Service Registration Awareness and Compliance Act".
- 13 § -2 Definitions. As used in this chapter:
- 14 "Military Selective Service Act" means 50 United States
- 15 Code App. 451 et seq.
- 16 § -3 Compliance; post-secondary education enrollment and
- 17 financial assistance. (a) Notwithstanding any law to the
- 18 contrary, any person who is not in compliance with the Military
- 19 Selective Service Act shall not be:
- 20 (1) Permitted to enroll in, or receive education from, a
- 21 state-supported post-secondary institution, including

1		a university, college, community college, professional
2		school, research facility, education center, or
3		institution within the University of Hawaii system;
4		and
5	(2)	Eligible to receive a loan, grant, scholarship, or
6		other financial assistance for post-secondary
7		education that is provided by, supported by, or
8		guaranteed by the State.
9	(b)	The University of Hawaii shall ensure that applicants
10	and enrollees under its jurisdiction comply with the Military	
11	Selective	Service Act for the purposes of this section.
12	S	-4 Compliance; state and county employment and
13	service.	(a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, any
14	person who	o is eighteen years of age and older and less than
15	twenty-si	x years of age, and who is not in compliance with the
16	Military Selective Service Act, shall not be eligible for	
17	employmen	t by the State or any political subdivision of the
18	State and	shall not be eligible for service for the State or any
19	political	subdivision of the State including all offices, self-
20	governing	bodies, boards and commissions, departments, agencies,
21	institutio	ons, and instrumentalities.

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1	(b)	The State and respective counties shall ensure that
2	employees	under their jurisdiction comply with the Military
3	Selective	Service Act for the purposes of this section.
4	S	-5 Exceptions. A person shall not be denied a right,
5	privilege	, or benefit under this chapter for noncompliance with
6	the Milit	ary Selective Service Act if the person is:
7	(1)	Under eighteen years of age or twenty-six years of age
8		and older;
9	(2)	In the armed forces of the United States on active
10		duty, other than in a reserve or National Guard unit
11		or has already served in the armed forces or has a
12		condition that would preclude acceptability for
13		military service;
14	(3)	Neither a United States citizen nor a resident
15		immigrant;
16	(4)	A permanent resident of the Trust Territory of the
17		Pacific Island or the Northern Mariana Islands; or
18	(5)	Excused from registration for some other reason
19		provided by the Military Selective Service Act and
20		that reason is included in a written statement.

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1 § -6 Severability. If any provision of this chapter, or 2 the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held 3 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or 4 applications of the chapter which can be given without the 5 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions 6 of this chapter are severable." 7 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Description:

Requires compliance with the Military Selective Service Act to be eligible for enrollment in a state-supported post-secondary institution, qualify for state financial assistance for post-secondary education, or be eligible for state or county employment or service. Provides exceptions. (SD1)

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
