A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FALL PREVENTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that every year in
- 2 Hawaii, on average eighty-five seniors die, 1,960 are
- 3 hospitalized, and 8,700 are treated in emergency departments as
- 4 a result of falls. Falls among the elderly also result in
- 5 almost \$1,200,000 in hospital and physician charges. In
- 6 recognition of this critical public health issue, Act 153,
- 7 Session Laws of Hawaii 2014, established a fall prevention and
- 8 early detection coordinator position within the department of
- 9 health's emergency medical services and injury prevention system
- 10 branch. This position enables the department of health to
- 11 support a coordinated statewide approach to prevent and reduce
- 12 the impact of falls among older adults. Act 153 funded a new
- 13 position for a fall prevention and early detection coordinator
- 14 for fiscal year 2014 to 2015.
- 15 The legislature further finds that access to fall
- 16 prevention services and programs would significantly reduce
- 17 costs associated with falls in the elderly by expediting



- 1 treatment, minimizing serious long-term consequences, reducing
- 2 the extent of the injury, and in some instances, avoiding death.
- Falls among the elderly are a significant public health
- 4 issue. Yet, currently, there are insufficient resources to
- 5 develop a coordinated statewide approach to reduce and promptly
- 6 detect falls among the elderly. The program serves as a focal
- 7 point for statewide injury prevention and detection efforts to
- 8 ensure multidisciplinary support, coordination of prevention and
- 9 detection efforts, and continuity of implementation and
- 10 accountability.
- 11 The legislature further finds that continued support of
- 12 fall prevention programs and services ultimately results in
- 13 longer, healthier lives for the State's aging population.
- 14 The purpose of this Act is to make an appropriation to the
- 15 department of health for the full-time equivalent fall
- 16 prevention and early detection coordinator position established
- 17 by Act 153, Session Laws of Hawaii 2014.
- 18 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 20 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the
- 21 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year

- 1 2018-2019 for the full-time equivalent fall prevention and early
- 2 detection coordinator position established by Act 153, Session
- 3 Laws of Hawaii 2014.
- 4 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 5 of health for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2070.
